Letter from the Ryerson PTO Executive Board

The 2013-14 school year has been filled with continuing Ryerson traditions and establishing new ones. For the Kicking' It Old School Fun Fair, we once again dusted off the signs, placed the cones, fired up the grill, set up the games, and organized the prizes -- then welcomed family and friends to our school on the hill for Ryerson's venerable fair. For our upcoming Field Day, we look forward to our children taking to the Ryerson fields to run, jump, and laugh. And as we bid good-bye to our 4th graders, the Class of 2014, we will honor them, "Ryerson style," with high-fives on the blacktop and then an awesome party during the Fourth Grade Celebration.

We also continued our traditions of honoring the dedicated and amazing Ryerson teachers and staff who have the education of our children. From the back-to-school luncheon in August to the staff appreciation breakfast in May, we have expressed our gratitude for the Ryerson teachers and staff -- who are simply the best.

This year, we hosted our second *Give to Grow*, and proceeds from last year and this year continued the PTO's support of the arts and expanded the PTO's support of the sciences. Our cultural arts programs encompassed theater and drama, singing groups, instrumental music, and dance, and included the comedic (clowns), dramatic (a reluctant dragon), classical (violins), and contemporary (hip hop). And, throughout the year, the PTO supported science in the classroom with High Touch-High Tech. These arts and science programs are the direct result of your support, and we hope to plant the seeds so that *Give to Grow* will develop to provide ever greater support for the arts and sciences at Ryerson.

All the PTO are able to accomplish could not happen without the time and talent of our dedicated volunteers, for which we thank you.

It has been a wonderful year. Enjoy your summer, and we look forward to seeing you in the fall!



Ryerson Loves Science Week & Ryerson 3rd Annual Science Fair

During the week of April 7th, Ryerson celebrated Science Week. Acting as hands-on scientists, students tested out different scientific principles at various stations with Cool-ology:

- Kindergarten Weather Wonders
- First Grade Water Wonders
- Second Grade Amazing Matter
- Third Grade Forces and Motion
- Fourth Grade Design It/Build It

Through classroom visits by *ee*Smarts, students learned about clean, renewable sources of energy and the power of recycling. At an all-school assembly, students were introduced to the power of "Fire and Ice" by Mad Science.



The Science Fair itself was held on April 9th and provided a showcase for students to share their projects with their peers, teachers, family, and friends. Over 110 students, representing every grade, participated in the Science Fair. In addition, the Science Fair featured a demonstration entitled "How Cold is Cold?" by Sharon and Mike Vagell, as well as a see-and-touch table by the Yale Peabody Museum of Natural History. Finally, students participated in a new activity at this year's fair -- the Marshmallow Challenge! Teams of 2-3 students competed to build the tallest structure, in 15 minutes, with only 1 large marshmallow, 20 sticks of spaghetti, masking tape, and yarn.
