6:00 PM Review and Motion to Approve Jan 2023 Meeting Minutes 1st- Lindsay Gladue 2nd- Tyler Rhoads

6:01 PM Review Treasurer's Report: Shivon McKibben said that the PTO had a light month in terms of spending. Fall fundraising checks such as Box tops, Big Y and Five Below came in and were deposited in January. Overall, there was about \$1500 in income and \$300 in expenses.

6:02 PM Music and Movement class: Becky Wyzycki stated that the first class went well. Can increase capacity to 30 for the next date. Waiting to hear about when we can hold the next class.

6:03 PM Reading Rocks: Becky W. said that Reading Rocks is coming up next week. Spots are almost filled. **6:04 PM Valentine Grams:** Becky W. reported that about 130 have been sold at the time of the meeting. Pencils and more candy will be added to the grams since the size of the heart-shaped stress ball is smaller than expected. Please get in orders by Friday, 2/10.

6:04 PM Yearbooks: Becky W. stated the price of the yearbook is \$22 this year, only a \$2 increase. They are bought in sets of 50 from the printer, for example, 250, 300, etc. Becky Cluff added that the yearbook has to be submitted to the printer by May 1st and will be in by the end of the school year for distribution.

6:06 PM Skate Night: Becky W. said that January's Skate Night brought in \$340 profit. There were no issues and it had a good turn out. Possibly deciding on a March date. Going forward, The Skate Inn is requesting a minimum of 50 skaters.

6:07 PM Music and Movement (cont.): Jenna Motta added that there is no new date set yet, probably sometime in March

6:08 PM Ice Cream Social/BOGO Scholastic Book Fair: Liz Rhoads said tentative plan is mid to late May. **6:09 PM Read-a-thon:** The company will be sending marketing materials such as posters and flyers. Kick-off date is March 6th, which is also Dress as Your Favorite Book Character Day.

6:10 PM Teacher Conference Dinner: Liz Rhoads stated that parent teacher conferences will be Thursday, March 2nd and Friday, March 3rd. Dinner items are needed for March 2nd. 6:18 PM Harlem Wizards Update: Becky W. informed members that there would be too much to do in a short period of time but hopefully we can set it up for next school year.

6:19 New Business: Becky W. noted that Ryan Aubin, from the Rec Department, had reached out about combining efforts for hosting a family fun day that includes yard games, inflatables, food trucks, etc during a weekend. Profit would be split.

6:21 PM Schedule Next Meeting: Tues, March 14th 6-7 PM GES LMC and virtual.

6:22 PM Principal Comments: Ms. Love was in attendance. She said that the Budget season has kicked off. The last meeting took place on January 30th between the Administrators and the Board of Education. Right now there is a draft budget, which includes a 5% increase in fixed costs. Admin will continue to meet with the BOE over the next month. Special requests have been made to purchase more new playground equipment because the new pieces that were installed last year have been such a highlight for students at recess and for the community. There is a committee made up of fourth graders who has been picking out new choices for equipment. There is no new update on Mrs. Allard memorial. Probably sometime in the Spring.


