Comprehensive School Safety Plan

In compliance with State law and Board policy, stake-holders at our school engaged in a systematic planning process for the purpose of reviewing and updating our comprehensive school safety plan. This process included gathering and analyzing crime and safety data in order to develop reasonable safety goals relevant to the needs and resources of our campus. This Executive Summary details the two datadriven safety goals that resulted from our planning process.

Goal 1: Educate and train students and staff in the event of an active shooter using ALICE strategies.

Goal 2: Improve the procedures for the event of a disaster. Staff members need to clearly know their roles for each phase in the event of a disaster.




SPSA Goal #1:

SPSA Goal #2

- Parent Involvement: By the end of the year, increase in parent participation in the following areas: Parent Surveys, Parent feedback from participation in SSC, ELAC, Parent Workshops, and PFA.
- Chronic Absenteeism: By the first Wednesday of November, and on a trimester basis thereafter, sites will have identified students to be monitored as at-risk of chronic absenteeism.
- Student Engagement: Increase in K-12 Insight Survey where students report feeling safe on campus.
- By May 1, 2022, **Second Step** curriculum will be delivered in all classrooms in its entirety (100%).
- In the 2021-2022 school year, Country Springs earned a 93% on the TFI external review and received silver recognition. For the 2021-2022 school year, Country Springs will implement Tier 2 (Check in Check out) now that students are back in person and maintain over 90% on TFI walkthroughs.

SPSA Goal #3

- English Language Arts/English Language Development
 - Elementary: By the end of the year, all students identified as at-risk in reading will be enrolled in at least 2 full cycles of intervention that address specific reading skills needed to successfully complete all grade-level reading assessments.
 - English Learners: By the end of the year, as a result of high quality, daily Designated ELD and Integrated ELD instruction, each English learner students will increase their English language proficiency by 1 level in preparation for reclassification and successful completion of the CAASPP.
 - LTELs By the end of the year, a reclassification plan for each Long Term English Learner will be written in order to support the student's progress towards meeting the district reclassification criteria and successful completion of the CAASPP (CVUSD LTEL Form)
- Math:
 - Elementary: By the end of the year, all students identified as at-risk in mathematics will participate in Tier II Academic support provided by the grade level teachers.

SPSA Goal #3

- GATE: By the end of the year, all students identified as GATE will receive enrichment opportunities that address specific higher-level learning skills needed to successfully challenge gifted students.
- To support A-G Course Completion (High Schools only)
 - Students are reading at grade level in grades 1-3 and meeting grade level standards in ELA/Math for grades 4-6.
- To support the High School Graduation Rate: (Secondary Schools only)
 - All underperforming students will be provided cycles of intervention that lead to the successful completion of graduation course requirements.
 - All students at risk of not meeting graduation requirements will receive appropriate supports to ensure successful completion of graduation requirements.
