

In 1987, Congress passed a resolution designating March as Women's History Month.

# Who it Honors

- Sacagawea – Native American woman who helped Lewis and Clark's expedition in the early 19<sup>th</sup> century.
- Elizabeth Cady Stanton & Susan B. Anthony – fought for equality for women in the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century, more than 70 years before the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment gave women the right to vote in the US in 1920.
- Harriet Tubman – a spy who led slaves to freedom during the Civil War.
- Amelia Earhart – world's first female pilot.
- Madeleine Albright – first female Secretary of State in 1996.
- Misty Copeland – first African-American woman to be named Principal Dancer – highest level - in the 75-year history of American Ballet Theatre in 2015.
