Mr. Mark Williams reviewed the new procedures stating changes were made to Item 6.1 all 4th and 5th grade iPads will remain in the schools next year and not go home, the user fee will be reduced from \$30 to \$15, this will help to pay for the charging carts, 6.2 check-in procedures, we will return the same iPad to the same student next year, they will know every change and discrepancy with the iPad, scratched face, etc., they will give a copy of the signed statement to the students, we will not be chasing down chargers, best way to get them back is they will be reissued the same way they were turned in, 12th grade iPads will go to 9th graders refreshed and reloaded, 8th grade iPads go to 4th graders and the same will happen, we will replace covers to make them in good condition, in Items 7 and 8 there were changes to the damage procedures or lost or stolen, we did not charge in the past for damage, raise the price, lost or stolen, increase it, principal's discretion steps in at the 3rd incident, we have gotten a lot that we have repaired this year, it is obvious they have been fighting with them, they have thrown them out of the bus, the percentage is not that bad but with the total costs of charges and replacements is and we need some deterrent, Item 10 is games, we gave the students the ability to load games and take ownership of the device, parents have said it is a distraction, we propose allowing the games but a committee will review it and it will be edutainment (educational and entertaining), in addition they will be held to the code of conduct. Mr. Jimmy Addison requested a list by schools of the number of damaged, replaced, repaired iPads, how much was spent and if we appropriated enough money and what kind of problems we have had this year. Discussion was held regarding not charging as long as they return the device, if missing or stolen, we are proposing \$100, the average cost of repairing one is \$75.00 but we are asking for \$50.00, we need to charge enough for deterrent, if they cannot pay they will get a loaner and cannot take it home, any unpaid fines there will be no extracurricular activities or walking at graduation, we get calls from all over town they have found one, may have a problem collecting the fines, the user fee is reasonable, other systems charge higher, the user fee for 6th - 12th is \$30.00, some teachers are not giving homework, the elementary schools voted to keep them in the schools, when they go home it is not the 4th or 5th grader that is using them, it is the parents, cousins, etc. Discussion continued with Mr. Chris Maddox asking how many students have thrown their iPads out of the bus window. Mr. Mark Williams stated approximately 6 or 7. Mr. Chris Maddox stated if we know who the student is the parent deserves a letter, I have no patience for that, it is defiance and I would look at expelling for an intentional act like that but I will follow up with Mr. Weeks on it, we will not put up with that behavior. Mr. Mark Williams stated the rules are also that the iPad is not to be taken out of the case and there has got to be a deterrent for it. Mr. Chris Maddox stated if money is not a deterrent expulsion will get their attention. Mr. Franklin Jones stated I will not vote to expel a child for throwing an iPad out of the window.


Superintendent Recommendations


