## NEWS FROM OUR SCHOOL NURSE'S OFFICE

Below is the list of guidelines which will reduce the overall student illnesses, viruses and colds if followed properly. For colds and viruses, fluids and rest are needed to become better. Anytime you have a question regarding your child's health contact his/her physician.

- Fever equal to or greater than 100.0 or no fever yet your child is achy, pale and tired. Student should remain fever free without medications for 24 hours before returning to school. Students will be dismissed from the nurse's office if their fever is at 100.0 or greater.
- Episode of vomiting and/or diarrhea. Student should have no vomiting or loose stool for 24 hours prior to returning to school without medication.
  - Child refuses to eat prior to school and is complaining of stomach pains and/or discomfort
    - Nasal discharge which is green in color and continuous
      - Sore throat with swollen, tender glands
- Cough with colored phlegm, cough with fever or cough with chest pain and/or wheeze
  - Earache with continuous pain and/or fever
    - Rash with blisters and/or discharge

Please make sure your child is properly dressed. The weather can be finicky, please dress them in layered clothing. Please do not forget jackets, hats, mittens/gloves, and boots when necessary.

Additionally, please send in a change of clothes (weather appropriate) for your child to keep in his or her classrooms in case of an accident.

### **March 2022 Meeting Minutes**

**Date, Time, and Location:** Tuesday, March 8, 2022 GES Library Media Center/ Virtual

**Meeting Start Time: 6:04 PM Meeting Called to Order By: Becky Wyzycski**

**6:04 PM Treasurer's Report Shivon M.** gave a brief summary. There was income from the Valentine Grams, Parent teacher conference dinner donations, Skate night and Five Below fundraisers. PTO made \$762 in profit for the month.

**6:06 PM Motion to Approve Treasurer's Report:** 1st- Lindsay Gladue 2nd- Tyler Rhoads

**6:07 PM: Motion to Approve February Meeting Minutes** 1st- Tyler Rhoads 2nd- Lindsay Gladue

**6:07 PM Sock Concepts Fundraiser** Becky Cluff noted that 108 pairs were currently sold, totaling a \$400 profit. Socks will be delivered in 18-21 days.

**6:08 PM World's Finest Chocolates:** Becky W stated that so far, 40 permission slips were handed in. The chocolates should be delivered on the 17th and the fundraiser runs from March 22nd to April 14th.

**6:09 PM Yearbook: Becky W-** As of the time of the meeting, 54 yearbooks were sold.

**6:11 PM: Scholastic Book Fair: Becky C:** The fair will take place in the GES Gym May 9-11 from 4-7 PM. It will be a Buy One Get One Free Fair.

**6:12 PM Skate Night: Becky W.-** Skate Night will take place on 3/22 from 5-7 PM.

**6:18 PM Staff Appreciation Week:** One day there will be a snack cart. An Amazon wish list will be set up for parents to purchase from. The theme could be "Red Carpet Week". Some other ideas are breakfast, desserts and lunch, flowers and a competitive fundraiser where the students could donate money to their teachers.

**6:27 PM Holiday Shoppe-** Becky C talked about using the company Penguin Patch for next year's Holiday Shoppe. A tentative date was booked for December. The company provides free items for less fortunate students who would like to shop for their parents.

**6:29 PM Scott Katz from Step It up! Fundraiser:** Scott Katz joined the meeting virtually. The fundraiser provides an awesome, amazing experience for all students. It is a donation only based platform that lasts for two weeks. A custom website will be made and each student will have their own page to enter 10 or more cell numbers or emails. The outgoing message will be sent by their system. The minimum donation online is \$10.00 or cash/checks can be sent in in any amount. Students will receive three prizes after they bring back their completed "Golden ticket" the day after the kick-off assembly. No money has to be raised at this point. First week is the week of "WOW". Any students who entered 20 or more cell numbers or emails will be entered to win one of four mini fridges stuffed with cash. All students at GES, including Pre-K will be able to participate in the Day of Awesomeness. 7-9 "Wipeout" and "American Ninja Warrior" type inflatables will be set up. Students will be able to participate for 45-60 minutes. There will be no bouncy houses or equipment with bungee cords. The inflatables will consist of single lanes/dividers. Examples of activities/inflatables are human foosball, twister, slides, soccer darts, and velcro axes throwing. A DJ Dance Party is also included. 10-12 PTO volunteers would be needed so teachers can be involved with their students. Scott then explained the profit breakdown. If GES raises \$30,000 and up, the school would receive 50%, 30% pays for student rewards, 20-10% pays for the program and insurance, and 10% goes to the company. If \$29,999 or less is raised, the school receives 40% profit. On the Day of Awesomeness, it will take 90 minutes to set up. Scott and the inflatable guy will come to the school at 6:45 am. Volunteers would need to arrive at 8:30. The first group of students would begin activities at 9:00. May 23rd was held as a tentative date.

**7:20 PM Principal Comments:** Mr. Bordeau was in attendance. He said that we could make the Day of Awesomeness work, as well as the kick-off assemblies to go with it. He thanked the PTO for hosting the Conference Dinners and the families who donated.. He noted that there are new district wide branding standards for the Griswold Wolverine logo as far as athletic uniforms and spiritwear is concerned. He asked if the PTO could help with the installation of the new playground equipment over the summer.

**7:25 PM Schedule Next Meeting:** Was scheduled for Tuesday, 4/12/22 from 6-7 PM with a virtual option.

**7:27 PM NEW Business:** Lindsay Gladue suggested hosting 4th Grade Muffin morning in May since Covid restrictions have loosened and this will be their last year at GES.

**7:29 PM Raffle Winners:** Mr. Bordeau, Kate Erardy, and Nicholas Dzenis

**7:30 PM Teacher Participation Winner: \$15 check awarded to Brittany Cook**

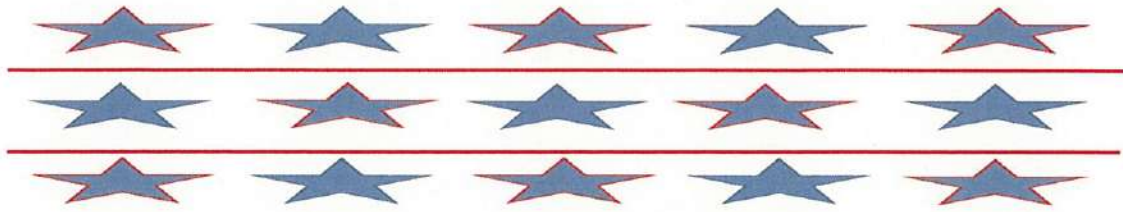
