CLASS LEVELS
We offer a variety of the following class levels each ½ hour long. Offered from 9:00am-12:00pm & 3:00pm-6:00pm.

### MOM or DAD & ME

(Infant & Pre-school Aquatics). Children of pre- school age are introduced to the water through this course. Parents participate in the water with the youngster. Class is taught by a Water Safety Instructor. Infants must be at least 6 months to 3 years of age. MUST WEAR SWIM DIAPER 6-8 Students per class

### TINY TOTS, LEVEL 2 (Primary Skills)

This class is designed for children 3 to 5 years of age. Emphasis is placed on water adjustment and fundamental skills. Students will learn to kick and move their arms together, 5-6 students per class.

The objective of this class is to teach students who may be a little timid about the water, but are more advanced than the Tiny Tots Level. Students will be introduced to the front crawl, floating & fully submerging into the water. 5 years & up. 6-7 students per class.

This class is designed to develop confidence in the strokes previously learned, and to improve other aquatic skills. Students will increase their endurance by swimming elementary backstroke and front & back crawl for greater distances than at level 3 the breast stroke and side stroke will also be introduced at this level. (class is conducted in deep water). 6 years old & up. (Must pass previous level). 8-10 students per class.

### INTERMEDIATE, LEVEL 5

In this intermediate level class students will increase speed, distance and endurance, while fine tuning the 4 strokes. The butterfly stroke will also be introduced. \*Students must be able to swim 25 yards (Must pass previous level). 8-10 students per class.

### SWIMMER, LEVEL 6

Skill proficiency- The objective of this class is to polish their strokes and to swim greater distances. This level also includes racing dives, flip turns and an introduction to the butterfly. This class consists mostly of workout drills to get students ready for High School Level competition. (Must pass previous level or equivalent). 15-20 students per class.

This program is specifically designed to accommodate to the strengths of students with special needs. Lessons are 30 minutes twice a week, free for students in a special day classes. Enrollment is on a first come first served basis. Must register at Recreation Office starting Monday May 13.
