Homework

Math homework is assigned most nights to reinforce the concepts learned in class that day. (Typically not assigned on test days)

20 minutes of reading is assigned each night. 2 passing AR quizzes are due at the end of each month to ensure that students are keeping up with their reading.

Students are expected to read a variety of books (both fiction and informational) around their level.

A passing AR quiz score is 75% or higher.



- Math DEN will occur on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays. Students will be rotating 4th grade classrooms based on their understanding of standards recently assessed.






Aeries Portal
