# Student Eligibility

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- 3.0 GPA or higher each semester during 4th and 5th grade with no D or F grades.
- Meets or Exceeds Standards on 4th grade ELA & Math State Tests. \*
- An average of 10 or fewer absences when looking at both 4th and 5th grade.  
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\*Students who don't meet eligibility criteria #2 and/or #3 may still apply; however, they will only be considered if space is available after acceptance of all students that meet all levels of eligibility.

# Honors Social Studies

## Ancient History

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- Cross curricular activities that align with Language Arts.

# Honors Language Arts

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- Through independent and collaborative activities, students will develop critical thinking, reading and writing skills, as well as, public speaking skills. Lessons will be taught using:

- Emphasis will be on:
  - Reading strategies
  - Non-fiction, cross-curricular texts
  - Document Based Questioning
  - Writing strategies and conventions





# Honors Math

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- Students will complete the 6<sup>th</sup> grade Common Core State Standards along with integration of 7<sup>th</sup> grade standards that will assist with grade level transition.
  
- Focus of 6<sup>th</sup> grade math
  - Ratios & Proportional Relationships
  - The Number System
  - Expressions & Equations
  - Geometry
  - Statistics & Probability





# Science / Science Lab

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- Students utilize observation skills with the metric system and present outcomes using data tables and graphs to organize their observations. NGSS
- Students will apply the scientific method through hands on lab activities using tools of the scientist: microscopes, triple-beam balances, graduated cylinders, scales, and hot plates.
- Students will explore career opportunities within the science fields, including educational requirements, career options, and current salaries.

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- Students will learn physical conditioning, rules, strategies and fundamentals of various team sports including:

# Application Process

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- Applications must include a copy of:
  - 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Report Cards showing Attendance through 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter
  - 4<sup>th</sup> Grade State Testing Results
  - Current Westside students must submit an Intra-District transfer form with the application (attached to application).
  - Students from other districts must submit an Inter-District Transfer form, available from that district office.





# Student Selection

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- The 6<sup>th</sup> Grade academy will have 99 seats available for students. A formula for the allotted seats per school will be applied. If applications from schools exceed their allotment, a lottery drawing will be used to select students.





# Registration

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- All applications must be submitted in person by 3:30 P.M. on Friday, April 13<sup>th</sup>, 2018 at our District Office. **There is no benefit in submitting the application early.**
- Notifications will be sent in June.
