

Pelham City Schools Goals for Student Achievement 2018-2019

In Math: All students demonstrate growth and score Proficient or higher in Math on the Georgia Milestones EOG and EOC tests.

In Literacy: All students demonstrate growth in reading and writing and score Proficient or higher on the Georgia Milestones EOG and EOC tests.

Behavior: Increase Climate Star Rating scores by implementing Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) and reducing office discipline referrals.

Pelham Elementary School Fifth Grade Goals for Student Achievement 2018-2019

In Math- Our focus will be on memorizing multiplication and division facts.

In Literacy- Our focus will be on preparing students to read and understand longer texts.

Teachers, Parents, and Students – Together for Success

In Fifth Grade

Teachers will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of the ways we will accomplish this include:

- Provide math homework each day and encourage parents to support students by ensuring they complete work.
- Encourage parents to have students read independently daily and reach reading goal in AR or other school reading programs.
- Provide parent resources/trainings in math and reading through parent events, the PIRC, monthly parent newsletter and online websites.
- Stay in communication with parents through weekly folders and monthly parent newsletter.
- Spend at least 10 minutes a night reading a book, magazine, or newspaper.

At Home

PES parents worked with staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math at home. Some of the suggestions:

- Ensure that student completes daily math homework to support learning.
- Encourage student to read independently and follow school reading programs to improve fluency and comprehension.
- Help student focus with little distractions, set time, and place for homework.
- Stay informed with monthly parent newsletters available via email and school lobby, attend parent events or access information on the school website (online access in the PIRC or public library), and sign up for Remind updates.
- Communicate with teachers through conferences and weekly folders.

5th Grade Students

A sampling of Pelham Elementary School students were asked their ideas about how they can succeed in Math and Literacy. Students thought of the following ways to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Complete daily math homework and take home extra math sheets to practice when needed.
- Use Istation and other games at home to build skills in Math and Reading
- Read independently daily and use free apps and resources available.
- Talk to parents about school each day.
- Use websites such as USA Test Prep, Learnzillion, Weebly, and Nitro Type for support.
