


If you return with your summer goal met, you will earn a summer reading prize!

P.S. On the back is an OPTIONAL supply list if you plan to shop over summer when things are on sale.



You are NOT expected to purchase these items over summer. It is optional, BUT we know that things are on sale over summer and many students like to come prepared. These items are not mandatory to purchase for your student. We will provide the materials for your child. If you would like to make a donation we would appreciate it.

- Binder
 - You may choose the size; 1 inch is easiest for 5th graders. In 6th grade they will need a 2 inch binder.
- Binder Dividers
 - Pack of 6 (preferably plastic and no pockets)
- Colored Pencils
 - Twistables are easiest because they don't need to sharpen them.
- Markers
- Mechanical pencils and lead (0.7mm)
- Pencil Box
- Earbuds
 - These will stay at school. The dollar store has some. You could buy multiple pairs to keep in stock at home.
- Shoe Box
 - This is how you store your graded work that is handed back monthly. It is your insurance policy for when something may have been missed in the gradebook.
