Expectations

Honework: This year in 5th grade, your child will be expected to read every night, at least 20 minutes. Students will need to have their redling logs signed every night. Math, Social Studies, and Science honework will be assigned Monday-Thursday nights. Students are expected to complete honework every night, and have it ready to turn in the next day.

Agendas and Red Folders: Each student will receive an agenda to record homework assignments in, and a red folder to bring home important information. Students are expected to bring both of these to and from school everyday. If they are lost, another will need to be purchased. Even though your child is in 5th grade, we still encourage you to check both of these nightly for home to school communication

Handwriting: Legible handwriting is expected in 5th grade. Any work below this standard will need to be redone.

Technology

Chronebooks: Students and parents will be required to sign a contract with chromebook expectations. Chromebooks will be used daily during 5th grade for educational purposes only. More information will come home about technology.

Summer

Reading: Each student at Tigerville received 12 free, on-level books at the end of last school year. Students should continue to read during summer break. This will help keep them on grade level!:)

Practice: It would also be helpful if you could continue to work on multiplication and division facts through I2. Much of the math we do in 5th grade will be much easier if students know the basic facts.
