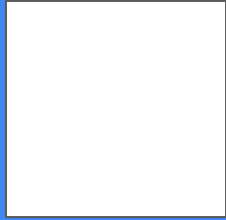

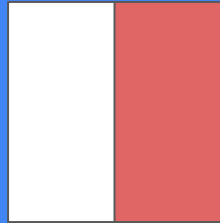


4th Grade

all day



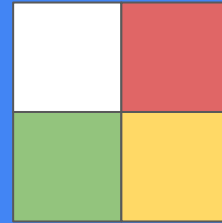
5th Grade

6th Grade

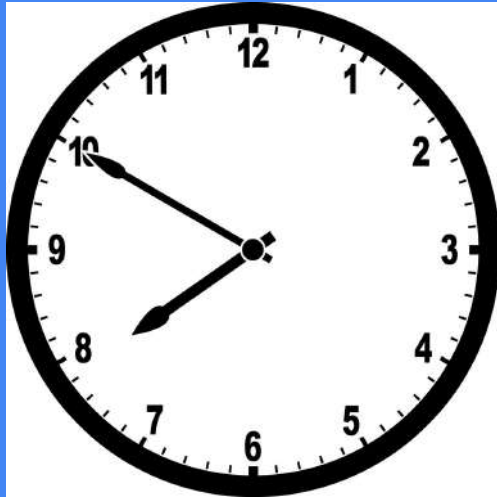
4 teachers

Big Changes

from 4th to 5th Grade



- earlier schedule
- nightly homework
- letter grades & interim reports
- new opportunities, including one-to-one devices
- increased independence
- PE, health, & art 1x / week
- band and / or choir 2x / week
instead of general music
- world languages 3x / week

- teaching organizational strategies
- offering homework club
- having Flex block



What Can Families Do to Help Over the Summer?

- read, read, read (make books available)
- read together & talk about what you've read
- keep math skills fresh
