How to Avoid the "Summer Slide"

With Summer coming very soon, I am sure that families are considering looking into summer activities for their students to participate in so they can continue polishing the skills they have begun to develop and work on at school. The following are tips that I have put together gathered from resources that were shared by other educators. I hope you find them useful, and perhaps can practice them with your students this upcoming summer. – Ms. .White & Mr. Ayala

Tips to avoid " Summer Slide":

1. <u>Six books to summer success</u>: Research shows that reading up to six books during the summer may help a struggling reader with their fluency and comprehension. When choosing the six books it is best for students to choose books within their AR level, that they are not too hard or too easy for them to read.


2. <u>Visiting the local library</u>: Ask a librarian for help in selecting books that match your student's age level. Most public libraries have summer reading programs that motivate kids to read.

3. <u>Keep Reading Aloud</u>: Reading aloud benefits all children and teens, especially students who are struggling with their fluency and comprehension. One benefit is that you can read books that your child can't, so they will build on their listening and comprehension skills with grade-level and above books.

4. <u>Writing Journal</u>: Encourage your child to keep a journal and have your child write stories every week and record special events. Please check their work for: complete sentences and correct structure, capitalization at the beginning of sentences/proper nouns, ending with end marks (.?!), proper spacing between words, and correct spelling of common words.

Summer Camp: With a focus on developing the potential of kids, the Los Cerritos YMCA Day Camp Program ensures your child will have a safe positive environment to play, learn, and grow when school is out. A nutritious morning snack and afternoon supper is provided. Full day camp programs require children to bring a sack lunch. Activities include, but are not limited to: swimming, low ropes, rock climbing, summer reading programs, computer lab, and arts & crafts. Hours of Operation: 6:30 am to 6:00 pm, program hours: 9:00 am to 3:30 pm.
