### Mission Statement

Hillview Middle School 6th Grade Honors Academy will provide academic challenges, accelerated curriculum, and rigorous expectations. Classroom activities and curriculum will have real world applications in a collaborative environment, enhanced by technology and hands-on activities.

### Student Eligibility

- If using letter grades, the equivalent of a 3.0 GPA or higher each semester in 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade; no D or F grades. Students on a Standards Based report card must have “2” or higher scores each semester during 4<sup>th</sup> grade, **AND** “2” or higher scores on their 5<sup>th</sup> grade, 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter progress report. \*
- Students **must** have a “3” or “4” score in College and Career Readiness on their 5<sup>th</sup> grade, 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter report card. \*\*
- Scores at or above 70<sup>th</sup> percentile on the NWEA 5<sup>th</sup> grade, 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter Language Arts **AND** Math Assessments. Out of district students must show proficient levels on their 5<sup>th</sup> grade district assessments. \*\*\*
- Student Meets or Exceeds Standards on 4<sup>th</sup> grade ELA & Math State Tests. \*\*\*
- An average of 10 or fewer absences when looking at both 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade attendance. \*\*\*

\* - Students who meet grade requirements, but have multiple “2” scores, will be considered if space is still available after considering students who meet grade requirements and have “3” and “4” scores.

\*\* - Students from out of district must have an A/B or equivalent score in citizenship (or similar category) on their 5<sup>th</sup> grade report cards.

\*\*\* - Students who don't meet the bottom three criteria may still apply; however, they will only be considered if space is available after acceptance of all students that meet all levels of eligibility.

The program will have 99 seats. A formula for the allotted seats will be applied based on feeder school enrollment. A lottery will also be used.

### Application Process

- Applications **must** have the required eligibility documents attached or they won't be considered (see above.)
- Current Westside students must submit an Intra District Transfer application with their application.
- Students residing in another district must submit an Inter District Transfer application, available from that district office of residence.
