ASVAB, PSAT/NMSQT, & SAT/ACT UPDATE

ASVAB- The ASVAB is a **FREE**, in-depth aptitude test, interest self-assessment with career exploration tools. This test is **required** for students interested in serving in one of the United States military branches, **but is also available and valuable** for any student to take if they would like to explore career options and learn more about themselves. It is recommended that sophomores or above take the **ASVAB**. Tests will be on **November 15th** and again on **April 28th**. Sign-ups will be pushed out through Google Classroom mid-October. Study materials for this test can be found in the library or online. To create an account and have access to more information, visit: <https://www.asvabprogram.com/>

PSAT/NMSQT- The **PSAT** or Preliminary SAT is a standardized test that provides practice for the SAT in a similar test setting. This year the **PSAT/NMSQT** will be held on **Wednesday, October 25th** and is open to juniors and sophomores (juniors will be given priority). The **PSAT/NMSQT** could also qualify juniors for the National Merit Scholarship. Students that are interested can sign up using this link: **PSAT/NMSQT enrollment opens on September 1st and closes on September 15th...seats are limited.**

SAT/ACT- The use of SATs and ACTs to meet college admission requirements in the future is unknown, so TUSD is going to continue to offer opportunities for students to prepare. One of the best resources available to study for the SAT is Khan Academy. Students can create an account at <https://www.khanacademy.org/sat>. The more you practice and prepare, the better you will do! There are many great resources that are **FREE** online, so you do not have to pay for any study materials! Students should plan to take the official SAT or ACT in the spring of their junior year, but should take it no later than December of senior year.

Register for the SAT at collegeboard.org and/or the ACT at act.org. Students **MUST** send scores through these websites for them to be considered official. If you need help registering and/or sending your scores, make an appointment with Mrs. McBay in the Career Center. Fee waivers for both the SAT and ACT are available for students.
