7th-grade, ELA COURSE SYLLABUS:

Welcome to 7th-grade Language Arts! Not only will the students taking this course become masters of the California Common Core State Standards for 7th-grade, they will finish the year wholly prepared for the rigorous Language Arts curriculum that awaits them in eighth grade and beyond. It is

the goal of this class to enable all students to be effective thinkers, planners, organizers, and communicators. However, this task is impossible to do alone; thus, I look forward to working as a team (students, parents, teachers, and administrators) to advance my students to be successful, responsible, independent young adults.

COURSE OBJECTIVES AND STANDARDS:

By May of this school year, each student will:

- Raise his or her Lexile reading level by at least 100 points.
- Use his or her knowledge of word origins and relationships to determine the meaning of words.
- Read and understand grade-level appropriate material; focus on informational material.
- Read and respond to historically or culturally significant works of literature.
- Write clear, coherent, and focused essays that exhibit awareness of content, organization, audience and purpose.
- Write narrative, expository, persuasive, and descriptive texts of at least 500 to 700 words
- Write and speak with a command of Standard English language conventions (grammar, syntax, and punctuation).
- Deliver focused, coherent presentations that clearly convey and relate ideas to the background and interests of the audience.
- Deliver well-organized formal presentations employing traditional rhetorical strategies.

NUTS AND BOLTS:

Every student at Townsend Junior High received an "Agenda" (day-planner) book to organize him or herself. *At the beginning of every class*, your child is expected to copy from the whiteboard the plans for the day into this Agenda. This will inform my students (and you) what we are to do that day and what kind of homework is required. Homework,

about thirty-minutes per day, will be required Monday through Thursday nights and will be part of the overall grade.

The teachers and administrators at Townsend consider the Agenda to be a living, working document between your child, you, and me. Feel free to use it in communicating concerns or input to me, and I will use it regularly to notify you of any concerns or problems I see. **Please look at the Agenda daily.**

This is a classroom that will use district provided laptop computers regularly and students will want online access at home; we will also be posting items to Google Classroom. Specifically, our textbook (https://launchpad.classlink.com/chino) has strong online components, as well as much of the homework will utilize online sources – "Smart Phones" with internet capabilities can be utilized if students have access. If you do not have access to the internet at home, computers will be available in the school's library before, during lunch, and after school most days.

CLASS WORKLOAD REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Classwork, homework and reading for a minimum of 30 minutes per day = 25% of grade
- 2. Quizzes, tests, book reports, projects, and essays = 75% of grade
