2. Restorative Justice

- a. Mr. Jimenez explained the purpose behind Restorative Justice and the need for Mr. Gerking
- b. Mr. Gerking presented a Restorative Justice Presentation.
 - i. The difference between past practice regarding discipline we went directly to punitive disciplinary practices compared to the process of restorative justice.
 - ii. Restorative Justice's main goal is to create and maintain healthy relationships among the different groups of people on campus.
 - iii. Circles are guided conversations where students/staff/parents are asked questions and given prompts to have a meaningful conversation to build or repair relationships.
 - iv. The goal with the circles is to create and maintain relationships, and most importantly the participants learn how to repair relationships (if that is the intention of the circle).
 - v. Circles are held in classes or they are scheduled based on the reason why the circle is needed.
 - vi. Tier 1 Circles build a sense of community among the participants

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- vii. When there has been harm (disagreement, teasing, drama, verbal argument) restorative Justice has a Tier 2 circle. This is a way to repair the relationship and learn how we can grow and make future goals.
- viii. Tier 3 is a re-entry circle, this is to re-introduce a student on to campus after a suspension or incarceration.
- ix. Mr. Gerking is working on translating the materials in Spanish for the website.
