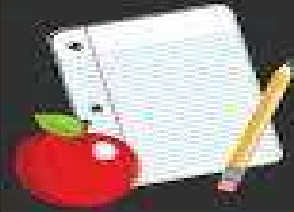

Definition of Title I

- Title I provides federal funding to schools to help students who are low-achieving or at-risk of falling behind.
- Title I funding is allocated to schools based on the percentage of students receiving free/reduced lunch.
- Schools with a percentage of at least 40% are eligible for a schoolwide program.

- Title I funds are used to serve all children in order to raise academic achievement.
- Title I funds will be used to provide additional assistance to all students who experience difficulties in meeting proficiency on North Carolina's End-of-Grade (EOG) assessments.

EXISTING PROFICIENCY LEVELS AND GOALS from 2020-2021

EOG Reading 30% Proficient

EOG Math 15.2% Proficient

EOG Science 57.3% Proficient

- This is not indicative of a normal year, but a result of the many challenges that the pandemic has had on teaching and learning during the 2020-2021 school year. .



NEEDS ASSESSMENT SUMMARY:

- Bladenboro currently serves 266 students. These students include: 20% Black, 13% Hispanic, 56% White, 7% Two or more races, and 2% American Indian.
- As a result of the pandemic data shows that students experienced loss of learning for the 2020-2021 school year.
- Based on reading EOG scores 18% of students were Level III, 9.4% were level IV, and less than 5% were level V. 70% of our students were not proficient in reading.



- Based on Math EOG scores 8.7% of students were Level III, 5.8% Level IV, and less than 5% were level V. 84.8% of our students were not proficient in math.
- Bladenboro Middle School will continue to focus on improving reading/math skills by using supplemental programs such as iReady diagnostics assessments and individualized lessons.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT FOCUS GOALS

- Bladenboro Middle School's School Performance Grade for the reading EOG will increase by 5% based on data from 2020-2021 school year.
- Bladenboro Middle School's School Performance Grade for the math EOG will increase by 5% based on data from 2020-2021 school year.
