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**I. COURSE DESCRIPTION:** This is an 8th grade course that exercises and expands all four realms of language arts: reading, writing, speaking, and listening. Students will be reading assigned literature as well as outside books, and writing will be developed through a variety of techniques and styles. Students will also be engaged in activities that advance speaking, listening, and presentation skills.

**II. OBJECTIVES:** Students will show mastery of the Common Core Standards for English Language Arts in pursuit of high-school readiness. Students will engage in learning activities and assignments which develop the skills required for grade eight English language arts.

#### V. ASSIGNMENTS:

<u>Category 1 - Essential Assignments (60% of overall grade)</u>: EAs must be turned in on the assigned due date to be eligible for full credit. Many EA assignments must be submitted electronically through <u>www.Turnitin.com</u> along with a final printed copy to the teacher – pay careful attention to directions for each project.

- <u>No Mastery</u>: EAs which do not meet mastery requirements (at least a 70%) will be given back to the student for revision. Completed revisions which display mastery skills will earn a 70%.
- <u>Late EAs</u>: Late EAs will be reduced 10% each day until it cannot receive a grade higher than a C-/70%. An assignment that is turned in late must be complete and meet all mastery requirements to receive passing credit. *Please see "Excused Absences" on next page for absence policy.*

<u>Category 2 – Daily Learning (30% of overall grade)</u>: Homework, class work, participation, and miscellaneous assignments must be turned in on the due date for full credit.

• <u>50% will be docked from late assignments in this category</u>. An assignment that is turned in late must be complete and meet all mastery requirements to receive credit.
