



FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS



- TAKING A FOREIGN LANGUAGE IS NOT A REQUIREMENT TO GRADUATE FROM THE DAVIS SCHOOL DISTRICT.





TESTING

- PLAN (SOPH) PRACTICE TEST TO PREPARE FOR THE ACT.
 - ACT (JR OR SR) ENTRANCE TEST FOR COLLEGE. MAY TAKE MORE THAN ONCE. ACCEPTED BY ALL UTAH SCHOOLS.
 - PSAT (SOPH OR JR) NATIONAL MERIT TEST. IT ALLOWS STUDENTS TO COMPETE IN A NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION. IT IS USUALLY GIVEN IN OCTOBER.
 - SAT I AND SAT II (JR OR SR) ACHIEVEMENT TESTS REQUIRED BY MANY OUT OF STATE UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES.
 - ASVAB ARMED SERVICES VOCATIONAL APTITUDE BATTERY. THERE IS NO COST FOR THIS TEST.
 - SAGE TESTS END OF LEVEL TESTS REQUIRED BY THE STATE IN CORE CLASSES.
 - AP TESTS A SERIES OF TESTS IN THE SUBJECT AREA FOR POSSIBLE COLLEGE CREDIT GIVEN IN MAY.

ACADEMIC CORE MAKE UP CREDIT


