Dear Vineyard Families:

There is no better time than the New Year to celebrate the successes of our students and to set new goals. Our students' efforts certainly shined during our Renaissance Rallies for each grade level in December. We celebrated students who earned a 2.0 GPA or higher by providing a special assembly. Several Scholar Athletes were honored during this special student rally as well. We look forward to honoring more students at the end of second trimester. To help your child achieve the GPA to qualify for Renaissance, we highly encourage you to monitor student progress through our Illuminate portal on a regular basis. Your child's progress report will be sent home on Tuesday, January 8, 2019. This is a perfect opportunity to review grades with your child and to set new academic goals for the remainder of the year.

Now that we are into the new year, we need to take advantage of our most important time of the year, our learning season! Good attendance will contribute to your child's success in school. The next few months are the most crucial in ensuring our students have mastered the grade level standards and are prepared for the next grade level. Beginning in February, our students will take Interim Assessments in both Language Arts and Mathematics so that teachers can guide their instruction and help to prepare our students for our upcoming state assessment, CAASPP (California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress) that will take place in April.

Our annual Spelling Bee will be on February 20, and we encourage both our 7th and 8th grade students to participate in this event. In the past, we have had a student advance to the national level. This is a wonderful and fun opportunity to help students improve their spelling, increase their vocabularies, learn concepts, and develop correct English usage that will help them throughout their lives. First and second place winners in this competition will also be awarded gift certificates donated by our PTSA.

A special thanks goes out to our dedicated PTSA Board for working endless hours to organize fundraisers to benefit our students and supplement vital programs at Vineyard. Celebrating Academic Success!

The **Renaissance Program** is in its thirteenth **year** at Vineyard Junior High. Students will receive incentives and rewards for attaining academic success and good citizenship at different levels.

Gold is 4.0 and higher, Silver is 3.5-3.99, Bronze is 3.0-3.49, Purple is 2.5-2.99 and Red is 2.0-2.49. Students may not have any N's or U's in citizenship or any D's or F's. At the end of each trimester, we hold a Rally to honor students at each of these levels. They receive a School Reward Card and gift bag. Promotion Requirements

The Alta Loma School District requires students to have a **Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 1.6 or higher** by the end of their 8th grade year to participate in 8th grade Promotion and related activities. Promotion Activities include a Knott's Berry Farm trip, the Promotion Party, and the Promotion Ceremony.

Students who are in danger of not meeting the GPA requirement are given the opportunity to earn positive GPA credit through Learning Upgrade. Those students also meet regularly with the Dean of Students, and letters and copies of transcripts are sent home to parents.

If you have any questions regarding this policy or are concerned that your son or daughter may be in danger of not meeting the GPA requirement, please contact Mrs. Vass, Dean of Students, at (909) 484-5120.

Beginning the 3rd trimester, 7th and 8th grade students will be put on a demerit system. Demerits are earned through discipline infractions such as: referrals, tardies, gum, and bus tickets. Eighth grade students who earn more than 40 demerits will be unable to attend the following activities: Knott's Berry Farm and the Promotion Party. The Promotion Ceremony is not affected by demerits if the student has met the GPA requirement.

Seventh grade students with 40 or more demerits and/or those who are on the ineligible list will be unable to attend Scandia and the End of the Year Celebration.

Demerit Information

We want to be proactive, informative and to work in partnership with you to help prevent students from earning demerits. Therefore, a letter will be coming home with your child on February 12 (8th grade) & February 13 (7th grade) to outline the demerit system. Please sign and return it to the office or your student's Homeroom teacher.

G.A.T.E

Alta Loma School District offers a
Gifted and Talented Education Program for
students in grades four through eight. Students in
grades three through seven are eligible for
consideration. Either a parent or teacher completing
the appropriate application forms can make a referral.
The required forms are available at the school site.
Data is collected from test scores, school
performance, pupil records, and questionnaires.
In addition, a test is administered in January to all
students referred. Information about the program is
available in the school office. Mrs. Bach will administer
the GATE test on January 16, based upon the
referrals.

Independent Study Program

We want to make families aware of the Independent Study Program available at your school site when a five (5) or more day absence from school is unavoidable. Of course, students benefit most from directly participating in classroom instruction and absences should be avoided. However, in rare instances, an extended absence period from school may be required. If parents have a planned absence of 5 or more consecutive days, they may request an Independent Study Contract from the school Attendance Clerk. This should be done at least 3 full school days prior to the absence to allow teachers and office staff time to prepare the student contract. Students are expected to return all completed assignments on the due date designated on the Contract.



"Preppy K" Program (Transitional Kindergarten)



Alta Loma School District offers a Transitional Kindergarten or "Preppy K" program for students who fit age and need requirements. Preppy K is the first year of a two year kindergarten readiness program. We know that Preppy K aged children benefit from exposure to developmentally appropriate environments and learning strategies that enhance their emotional, social, and academic skills. Preppy K provides the opportunity for children to be better prepared to succeed in kindergarten and beyond.

The **Kindergarten Readiness Act** was designed to help ensure that for students who qualified, a year of kindergarten readiness would provide a strong early start to help children read proficiently by the third grade- a critical milestone that predicts whether or not a student will graduate from high school. This legislation changed the requirements for Kindergarten entry from 5 years old by December 2nd, to five years old on September 1st.

All students beginning Kindergarten must be 5 years by September 1. Four year olds with birthdays between September 2 and December 2 are provided an additional year to prepare for Kindergarten by attending Preppy K. Our District provides the opportunity to receive Preppy K services for students who are not quite ready for kindergarten, as well as those students who will turn five by January 31.

Preppy K classes are being offered in school sites throughout the district. Registration packets will be available in the office of your home school on February 1, 2019. We encourage you to pick up a registration form and submit it to your home school.
