Why Listening Skills?



- ➤ Listening contest is designed for students in grades 5-8
- ➤ It recognizes the importance of effective listening skills and to identify problems they may have in listening effectively.
- ➤ It also provides a challenging format to test the improvement of their listening abilities.
- Through preparation, participants will listen actively to a variety of material and learn to analyze and evaluate a speaker's message critically.





Skills Needed



- identifying the main idea and supporting ideas
- drawing conclusions
- distinguishing fact from opinion
- other listening and thinking skills.

- use their notes to answer 25 multiple choice, true/false and short answer test questions.








Listening Skills Scripts


Note Taking during the Lecture

- → Fill in the gaps







