Dear Vineyard Families:

We are excited to share that Vineyard has just been recognized as a **California Distinguished School for 2019**. This prestigious award is attributed to our incredible students, dedicated staff, and partnership with the community. We are proud to be among one of eleven schools recognized in our county.

As we navigate through our third and final trimester, we have plenty of exciting events taking place here at Vineyard. Foremost, we want our students to continue to remain focused on their studies and to continue to put forth their **personal best** in all academic areas. In order to maximize learning, it is important for students to strive for perfect attendance and to be punctual to school on a daily basis. We have had an increase in tardies and would appreciate your support with ensuring that your child is at school on time each day.

During the month of **April**, your child will be taking the **CAASPP** (California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress) **state test**. All of our students have been participating in taking the Interim Assessments as part of their Language Arts and Math classes to learn strategies to prepare them for the state testing. Students in eighth grade will still take the CAST (California Science Test) Field Test in the beginning of May. If you are interested in additional practice for your student prior to the state test, you will find practice assessments on line at http://www.cde.ca.gov/ta/tg/sa/practicetest.asp.

It is important that students be at school during the testing window. We respectfully request that you plan appointments and days out of school at another time. During the testing season, we need to reduce disruptions to the classroom. Please help us by making after school transportation arrangements with your child in the morning before they leave home. Deliveries such as lunches, PE clothes and after school sports gear will be stored on a table in the office to minimize classroom disruptions.

This month, our eighth grade students will be going to an orientation at Los Osos High School on March 14. Registration packets will be issued at that time. Be sure to mark your calendars for March 20 for the Los Osos Parent Information Night (more information will be sent home).

Please join us for our annual **Open House** on **March 19 from 6:00–7:30 pm.** Parents will have the opportunity to visit their child's classrooms and teachers to see all of the wonderful learning taking place. We hope to see you there! Our choral students will be joining the Los Osos Choir for a Spring Concert on May 8 (LOHS at 7:00 pm) and our Spring Band Concert will be held on May 14 (LOHS at 7:00 pm).

Please check our website regularly as we will be updating even more exciting events. We look forward to our Awards Assemblies in May. The 7th grade Awards Assembly is on May 6 at 8:30 am and the 8th grade Awards Assembly is on May 7 at 8:30 am. Students being recognized will receive an invitation to the Awards Assemblies. REGISTRATION POLICY

We will be using Illuminate, our online student information system, to complete school forms required at the beginning of the school year again. Before student class schedules will be given out in July, parents will need to fill out the information required in the Illuminate Parent Portal during the month of April. In addition, all students will need to provide proof of the Tdap immunization in order to receive the student class schedules.

Promotion Requirements

The Alta Loma School District requires students to have a Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 1.6 or higher by the end of their 8th grade year to participate in 8th grade Promotion and related activities. Promotion Activities include a Knott's Berry Farm trip, the Promotion Party, and the Promotion Ceremony.

Students who are in danger of not meeting the GPA requirement are given the opportunity to earn positive GPA credit through Learning Upgrade. Those students also meet regularly with the Dean of Students, and letters and copies of transcripts are sent home to parents.

If you have any questions regarding this policy or are concerned that your son or daughter may be in danger of not meeting the GPA requirement, please contact Mrs. Vass, Dean of Students, at (909) 484-5120, or mvass@alsd.org.

Beginning 3rd trimester, 7th and 8th grade students will be put on a demerit system. Demerits are earned through discipline infractions such as: referrals, tardies, gum, hands-on, and bus tickets. Eighth grade students who earn more than 40 demerits will be unable to attend the following activities: Knott's Berry Farm and the Promotion Party. The Promotion Ceremony is not affected by demerits if the student has met the GPA requirement.

Seventh grade students with 40 or more demerits and/or those who are on the ineligible list will be unable to attend Scandia and the End of the Year Assembly.

Promotion Party

This year's 8th grade Promotion Party will be held on Friday, May 17, 5:30—8:00pm. This evening is put together every year by dedicated parent volunteers who spend many hours of their time to make it successful. If you would like to be a part of your student's promotion by volunteering to help plan the party or work at the event, please call Tamara Kalfopolous at 484-5120. We can use all the help you can give. Also, any donations would be graciously accepted!

Promotion Ceremony

The 8th grade promotion ceremony will be held on **Thursday**, **May 23th** on the upper field at 9:00 am. All 8th grade students who have earned a cumulative GPA of 1.6 or higher are invited to participate. The ceremony will end at approximately 10:30 am, and students will then be released to leave with their parents. The 8th grade Pan Picture will be taken on Wed. May 22, the day before promotion at 9:00 am. Order forms will be sent home and available in the office.

Promotion is an important event in your child's life and should be seen as a beginning not an ending. Therefore, the sophistication of formal evening dresses, tuxedos, and limousines are NOT appropriate or acceptable for a middle level promotion activity. Cotton dresses for girls (no strapless, spaghetti straps or midriffs, please), and a shirt and tie for boys are acceptable modes of dress for this special occasion.

ATTENTION 7th Grade Parents

As we approach the conclusion of your student's 7th grade year, please be reminded that in order for your student to qualify for promotion and related activities in 8th grade, they must earn a cumulative GPA of 1.6 or higher. Students who have failed classes will be given the opportunity to earn positive GPA credit by completing additional work.

Seventh grade students are also on a system of demerits in addition to regular eligibility of 2.0 or higher and 3 or less negative citizenship marks to qualify for the 7th grade end-of-the-year activities: The Boomers trip on May 16 and a special assembly. Information on these events and demerits were recently sent home to parents late February. If you have any questions, please call Judy Bach or Maureen Vass.

Vineyard Junior High Recognized as a 2019 California Distinguished School



Vineyard Junior High School is one of only 200 secondary schools in California and only 11 in San Bernardino County to be recognized as a California Distinguished School in 2019.

Junior high schools nominated for California Distinguished School status were evaluated on two categories: exceptional student performance for two consecutive school years and their ability to close the achievement gap between two school years.

Vineyard was recognized for its Viking Tiered System of Supports, a school-wide approach to meet the academic, behavioral and social-emotional learning needs of students. Through a shared responsibility and partnership between home and school, staff and parents work collaboratively to create a learning environment that promotes intellectual and social development, prepares students for college and career, and inspires learners for a lifetime of success in a global society.

Every student's individual unique needs are identified, evaluated and then addressed with the goal of improving the whole child in terms of academics, behavior and social-emotional learning, while embracing a growth mindset for continuous improvement. In addition to standards-based instruction, students are provided with a tiered system of academic intervention and enrichment opportunities.
