Pre K:

Hello from preschool! As the weather starts to change, please continue to send boots, snow pants, hats and mittens everyday. We do go outside everyday. A couple of skills we will be focusing on this month are alliteration and rhyming. Alliteration is listening for words that begin with the same sound (ball, boy, bed, blue) and rhyming is finding words that end with the same sound (bat, cat, rat, mat). Reading to your children is a great way to hear and practice both of these skills!

Kindergarten:

Happy March, Kindergarten families! This month we continue to work on blending sounds to read and write words. Please keep reading the decodable books that are sent home weekly. These books reinforce the skills that we are teaching at school and are a great way for you to practice reading with your child! In math we will start recognizing 2D and 3D shapes and making patterns out of them. This month, please continue to send all winter gear with your child as it can get very messy outside with melting snow. Thank you so much!

1st Grade:

Hello families! We would like to thank everyone who made it to Parent Teacher Conferences in February! We appreciate your time and your support! This month, we encourage you to continue reading at home with your child. As you read, you can strengthen skills we'll be reviewing by asking your child to use details from the stories to describe characters, settings (where and when the story takes place), and major events. We will also be reviewing how to ask and answer questions about key details. In Math, we will move on to measuring and graphing. We would like to send a gentle reminder to help your child keep all toys and candy (including juice and pop) at home. Thank you for all of your help!

2nd Grade:

Thank you so much for coming to conferences in February. We are partners in education with you and your child and enjoyed the opportunity to visit with you. In math during March, we will be learning about money-identifying pennies, nickels, dimes and quarters. We will be finding the value of groups of coins and determining combinations of coins that equal a given amount. We will also learn about data and graphs and use addition and subtraction to create and obtain information from tables, bar graphs and tally charts. In literacy, we will be recounting stories and determining their central message, lesson or moral. In writing, we will write an opinion book review. We will continue to practice STAR behavior at Roosevelt and show kindness to each other. Remember how important your child reading is each and every night!

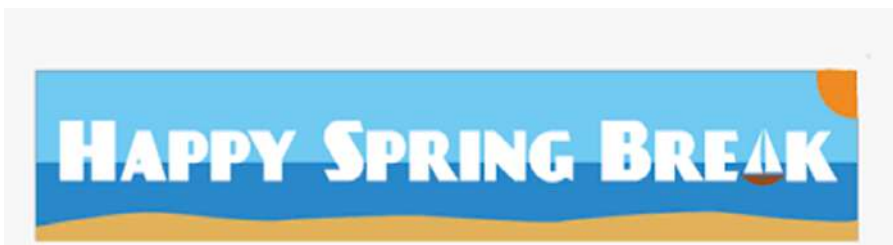
5th Grade:

Hello families!

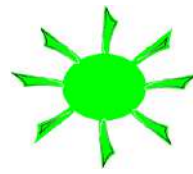

EL:

Kindergarten: In kindergarten STEM we are learning about the different things animals and plants need to survive.

1st Grade: In first grade STEM we are learning about plants and how they grow.

2nd Grade: In second grade STEM we are learning about where water is found on Earth.

3rd Grade: In third grade STEM we are learning about the moon and its different phases.

4th Grade: In fourth grade STEM we are learning about magnetic forces.

5th Grade: In fifth grade STEM we are learning about sun and star brightness.
