## Great Staff Training at GMS!

## SB Assessment 2016

As you may know, GMS is in the process of completing the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SB) of the Common Core State Standards (CCSS). This was the third year the SB was given and the second year that the full assessment was given. Same as last year, the performance task is based on students doing group work, doing some research, and then answering some tough questions. It is a very rigorous test.

The state of California wants schools to communicate two important things about this year's test. The first thing is that you can't compare the SB state test to the old CST state test because they are very different tests (computer based with a lot of writing v. paper and pencil with multiple choice only). Again, it would be like comparing a sports car (SB) to a horse (CST) because they are both forms of transportation, it just wouldn't make sense. The other thing we need to communicate is that because the SB is a much harder test, the state knew that the number of kids who would get a rating of "standard met" would be lower, regardless of what school students attend. Our results from last year were comparable to other middle schools in the Whittier Area and equal to other schools in California with students who are similar to our students. Our goal as a school is to always get better and help our kids grow academically, thus, we strive to improve every year.

We also sent a TEAM of teachers to the AVID Summer Institute last summer and to Downey so they could learn what we affectionately call WICOR strategies. WICOR strategies are teaching strategies that help kids write better and take good notes, ask and answer high level questions, and work together to learn new things and to perform various tasks. In addition, WICOR includes helping kids get organized with orderly binders, and by having them complete a daily agenda so they keep track of their homework, tests, and activities. It also includes helping kids use different strategies to comprehend what they read. Our teachers work closely with Mr. Honeycutt, our instructional coach, to use the various strategies they learned in their classrooms so we can help our kids learn the material and information. Although we have a very effective veteran staff, we always want to learn and get smarter about how we support our kids' learning.

Our spring sports program concluded with our 8<sup>th</sup> grade boys' soccer team having had a lot of success and our 7<sup>th</sup> grade boys' soccer team dominating the league.
