The Corona-Norco Unified School District Summer Bridge Program is free and designed to help incoming 9th graders prepare for success upon entering high school. We have four programs to service many of our incoming high school students, which are held at the three summer school high school campuses, taught by CNUSD teachers in each field to provide the best exposure to curricula and skills needed in each area at the high school level.

Parents of qualifying students will receive an email by February 12th to enroll his/her student online.

Open to CNUSD 8th Grade Students:

Summer Bridge programs are only available to current 8th grade CNUSD students who are also scheduled to attend 9th grade at a CNUSD high school this fall. Students must also meet specific criteria for the specific course as outlined below.

Summer School Locations:

- Centennial High (Typically Santiago & Centennial students)
- Corona High (Typically Corona students)
- □ Roosevelt High (Typically Roosevelt & Norco students)

AVID Summer Bridge:

June 8 – July 2, 2020 7:45am – 10:55am

Overview: A qualified AVID teacher reviews key AVID skills and "a-g" and graduation requirements. Students earn 5 elective high school credits with a C or better.

AVID Connect (Roosevelt): Students will participate in the WICOR strategies of AVID to help them prepare for a successful transition.

AVID STEM (Corona HS): Students will participate in high engagement strategies to strengthen math and science skills.

Requirements: Must currently be in 8th grade year at a CNUSD school and have plans to be in AVID 9th grade year at a CNUSD high school.

How to Enroll: Parents of qualifying students must complete the 2020 <u>Online</u> Summer Bridge Enrollment. An email with directions and a link will be emailed by February 12th to all 8th grade students.

Due: Online enrollment must be completed by 3/30/20.

English Learner Summer Bridge:

June 8 – July 2, 2020 7:45am – 10:55am

Overview: A Language Arts teacher teaches this course to build and reinforce key English language skills while building vocabulary, literacy, and academic language in the areas of Language Arts.

Students earn 5 elective high school credits with a C or better.

Requirements: Must be qualified as an EL student, recommended ELPAC level 1, 2, or 3, and will be attending 9th grade at a CNUSD high school.

How to Enroll: Parents of qualifying students must complete the 2020 **Online**Summer Bridge Enrollment. An email with directions and a link will be emailed by February 12th.

Due: Online enrollment must be completed by 3/30/20.

SUMMER BRIDGE PROGRAMS rner Summer Special Ed Summer Bridge:

June 8 – July 2, 2020 7:45am – 2:40pm

Overview: A math and Language Arts Special Education teacher team-teaches this combo-class to work on key organization, study, note-taking, literacy, and mathematical skills essential for success at the high school. Students earn 10 elective high school credits with a C or better.

Requirements: This course is open to students who have an IEP who are enrolled in Basic/RSP or Essentials/SDC Math and Language Arts Special Ed classes (not recommended for students in the general education setting).

How to Enroll: Parents of qualifying students must complete the 2020 **Online** Summer Bridge Enrollment. An email with directions and a link will be emailed by February 12th.

Due: Online enrollment must be completed by **3/30/20**.

Math Summer Bridge (Offered In-Class or Online):

Session 1: June 8– June 19 Session 2: June 22 – July 2 7:45am – 10:55am 11:30am – 2:40pm

Overview: This course provides students with the opportunity to enroll in Integrated Math 2 (Regular/Enhanced) during their 9th grade year by completing all of Integrated Math 1 requirements. Please visit our website for detailed information.

Requirements: Must have earned a B for Semester 1 in the general education Math 8 class. No HS credit is earned.

Math Success Camp (only at CHS and ERHS)

June 8– July, 2, 2020 7:45am – 10:55am 11:30am – 2:40pm

Overview: In this 4-week course, students will grow confidence in their math abilities, expand and solidify their learning, and create a solid foundation for high school mathematics. Students will be encouraged to grow their mathematical thinking through positive messages, collaboration, and reflection about their learning process.

Requirements: This program is intended for students with a C- or below on Math 8. Students earn a 5 elective high school credit with a C or better.
