Every Class Counts!

- In order to earn class credit, you must pass the class with a 60 or better
- Each class passed= 1 Credit*
- Passing classes helps to move onto Sophomore, Junior, and Senior Year
- 24 total credits are needed to graduate High School
- You may earn more than 24 credits by the time you graduate from Garinger

Freshman	0-5 credits
Sophomore	6 credits (any courses)
Junior	12 credits (must include Math I, English I and English II)
Senior	18 credits (must include Math I, English I and English II)

*Remember you must earn 6 credits before you are promoted to the 10th Grade. There is no social promotion in High School!!

Graduation Requirements

- **4 English Credits** (English 1, English 2, English 3, English 4)
 - **4 Math Credits** (Math 1, Math 2, Math 3, and a higher-level math)
 - **3 Science** (Earth Environmental Science, Biology and a Physical Science)
 - **4 Social Studies** (World History, Civics, American History , and a 4th Social Studies)
 - **1 Health and PE Credit**
 - **8 Electives** (If College Bound-2 Foreign Language credits in the same language)
- **24 Total Credits to Graduate in 2026**



Block Scheduling

- **What is a Block Schedule?**

- Students will take 4 classes listed on schedule for each semester
- Classes are 80 minutes long
- SEL and Tutoring time for 30 mins each day
- Some classes are all year long and will follow an "A/B Day" schedule →

- More reading and writing.
- Moves at a faster pace.
- Students should have good reading comprehension, and are motivated.
- More independent work inside and outside of class.

Advanced Placement

- AP courses are taught on a college level.
- Students should be motivated, and self-disciplined.
- AP courses are year long courses on an A/B Day schedule, or everyday all year long.
- AP courses require **more** effort and homework than standard or honors level courses.
- Students are expected to exercise critical thinking skills, utilize problem solving skills, write fluently and absorb masses of content material on a daily basis.
- There will be a **required** summer assignment.

Your class level will depend on your grades and testing scores.

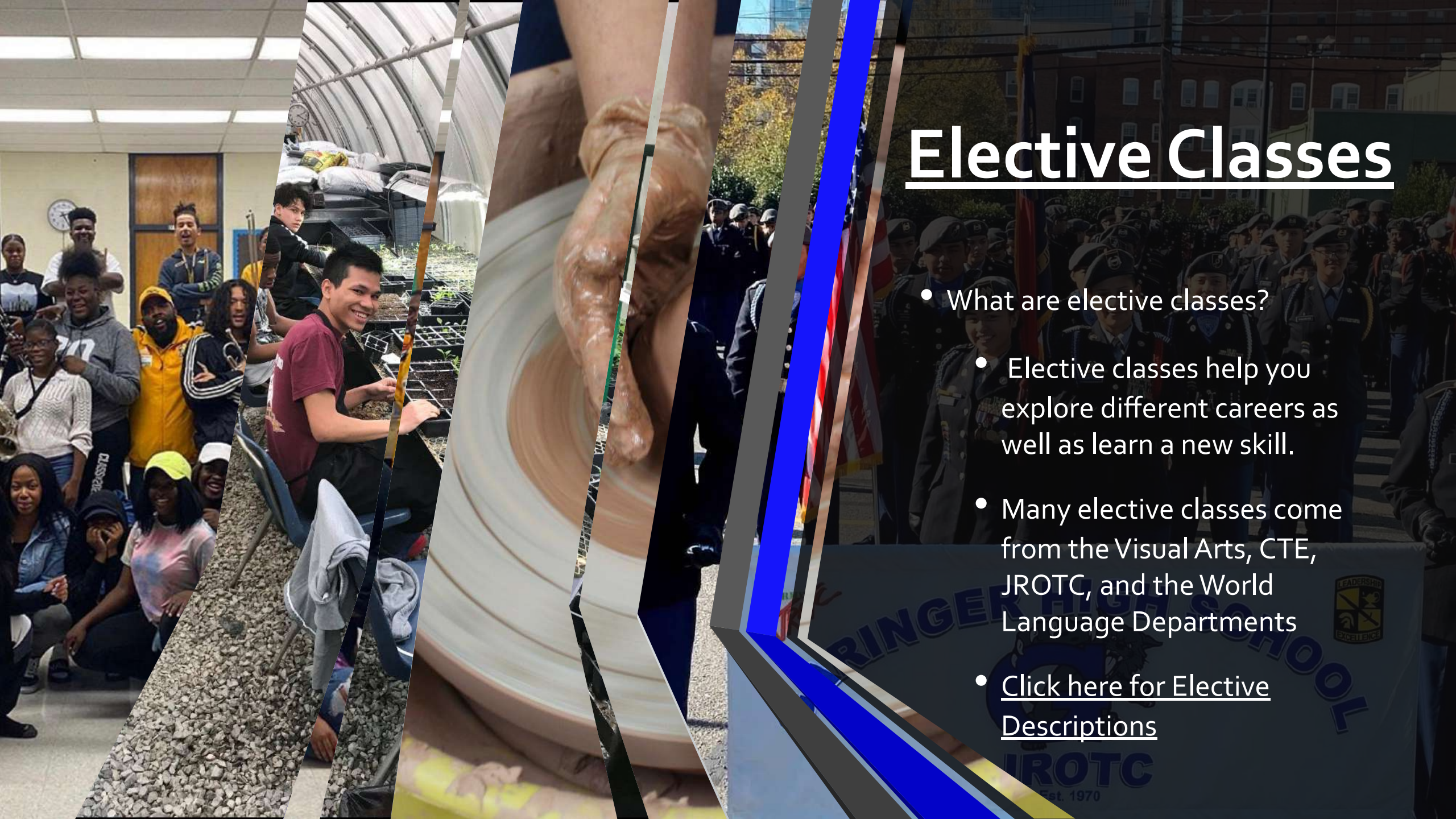

Visual Arts Courses Offered to 9th Graders:

Ceramics Beginner: Students will be crafting works of art including ceramics and drawing. We will learn the history of art, steps of specific craft making, as well as foundations of art including principals and design.

Contemporary Craft and Design Beginner: Explore different materials like clay, collage, yarn and painting. Learn about different cultures and art styles.

Visual Arts Beginner (also offered A/B day): Explore different materials like pencils, paint, oil pastels and sculptural materials! Learn about artists and art history. No drawing experience necessary



Performing Arts Pathway

Performing Arts Classes Offered to 9th Graders:

- **Beginning Band***- A performance-based class where students develop fundamental skills of music by playing an instrument.
- **Beginning Chorus***-Students study the fundamental skills of music, sight-singing, proper vocals, and vocal health. Any student who loves to sing is welcome to join!
- **Beginning Dance***-Students learn basic choreographic principles, structures and processes.
- **Beginning Orchestra***-Students develop fundamental skills of music, characteristic tone production, music terminology, posture, bowing, intonation, and expressive skills through ensemble playing and the study of simple orchestral literature.

Raider Challenge competitions

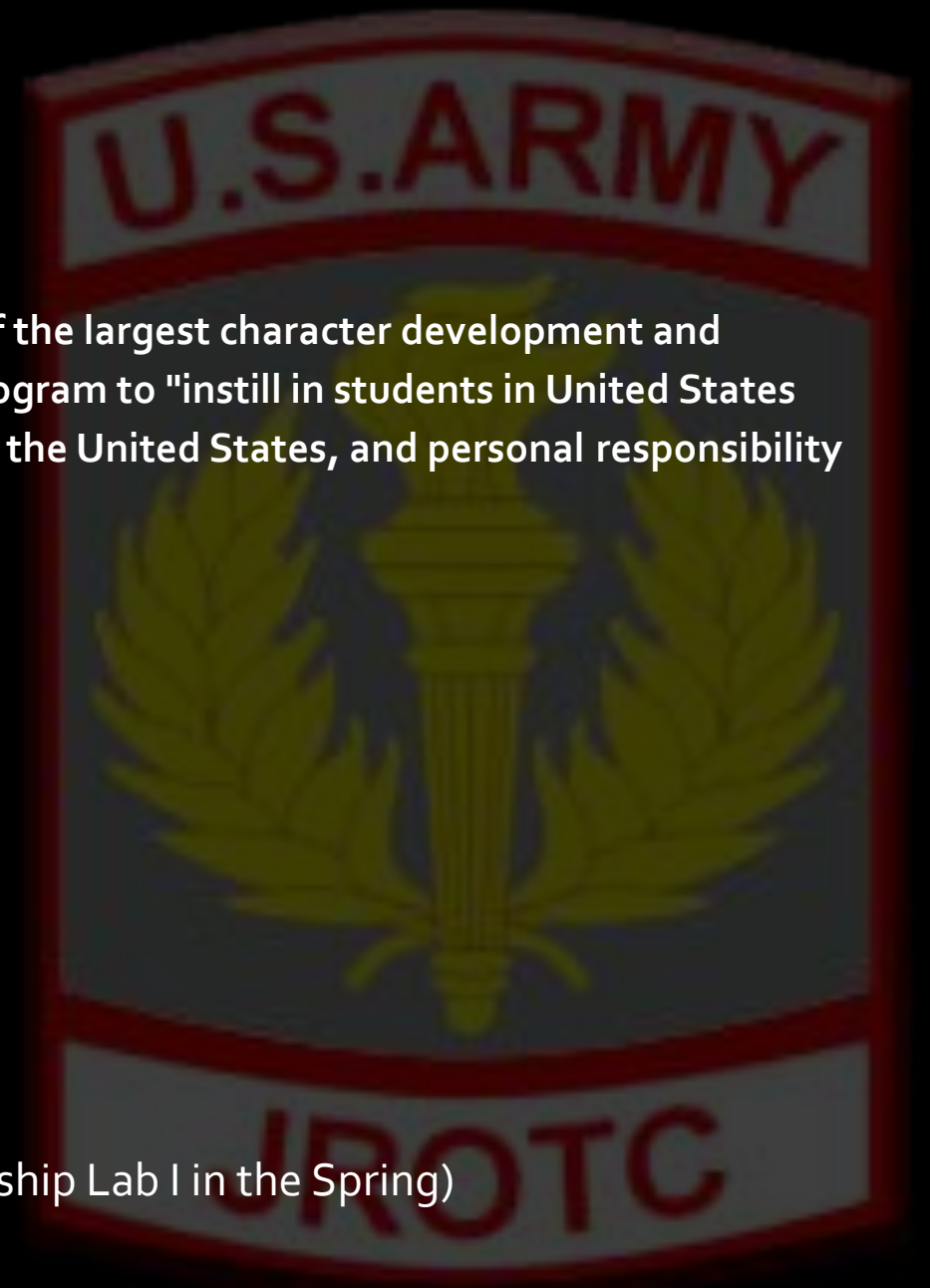

If you would like to attend a 4 year College/University after High School you must take two levels of the same World Language while in High School

- Spanish for Spanish Speakers & Honors Spanish 2 for Native Speakers
- French 1&2

It is okay if you do not take these courses your 9th grade year. You can still take any of these World Languages while in the 10th, 11th, or 12th Grades.

(Electives are not apart of a Pathway but may be taken by students)

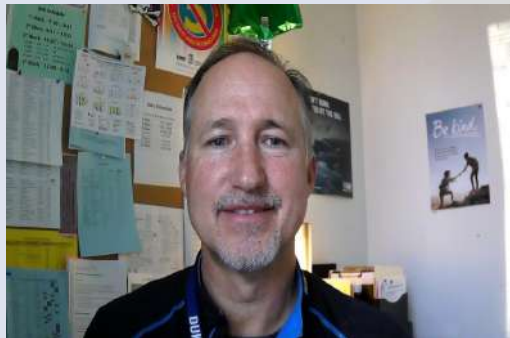
