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9th Grade Math Placement Criteria 2022-2023 School Year

All incoming 9th grade students will be placed into either Integrated Math I or Honors Integrated Math I. At Turlock High School there will also be an intervention course, supplemental to Integrated Math I, while at Pitman High School, interventions systems will be built into the Integrated Math I course and their embedded intervention period, Pride Time.

Honors Criteria

Students may become qualified for the Honors course by meeting the following criteria:

- 1. Minimum score of 2586 on the Smarter Balanced Math Summative Assessment (Met or Exceeded Standards)
- 2. Grade of B or better in Math 8, or C or better in Math 8E/STEM in the third quarter of 8th grade

Intervention Criteria

Students with the following criteria will be considered for an Intervention course and/or specified intervention time/resources, in addition to being enrolled in Integrated Math I:

- 1. Score of 2503 or lower on the Smarter Balanced Math Summative Assessment (Standards Not Met)
- 2. Teacher Recommendation

Placement Checkpoint:

All 9th grade math courses will have at least one placement checkpoint within 20 days of the school year to ensure accurate placement and permit reevaluation of individual pupil progress.
