
Having a student let their teacher know during a Zoom meeting they will be gone for any reason will not excuse the absence, although it is good practice!



## Suicide Awareness Month

WE ARE ALWAYS HERE TO HELP

Don't hesitate to raise the subject. Talking with young people about suicide won't put the idea in their heads. Chances are, if you've observed any of the warning signs, they're already thinking about it. Be direct in a caring, non-confrontational way.



# What to do if you see the warning signs?

1

If a friend or someone you know mentions suicide, take it seriously.

2

If he or she has expressed an immediate plan or has access to a gun or other potentially deadly means, do not leave him or her alone.

3

Get help immediately.

4

Talk to an adult you trust.

## Other key risk factors include:

- Readily accessible firearms
- Impulsiveness and taking unnecessary risks
- Lack of connection to family and friends (no one to talk to)

# These warning signs are especially noteworthy if there has been:

- A recent death or suicide of a friend or family member
- A recent break-up with a boyfriend or girlfriend, or conflict with parents
- News reports of other suicides by young people in the same school or community

## GEAR UP and AVID

## What is GEAR UP? Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs

- GEAR UP is a program funded by the Department of Education
- It is a Federal Grant that lasts for 7 years, that gives funding to communities to increase the # of students who go to college and graduate from college and other post-secondary education programs
- It will end after the class of 2025 graduates\*\*

## **GEAR UP Achievers – South King County**

Our goal is to dramatically increase the number of students who enter and succeed in post-secondary programs

- Grant is focused on South King County (Renton, Kent, Auburn, Tukwila)
- Specific support for first generation, low income, and students of color
- Started in 2019, with 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> grade (Class of 2024 and 2025)
- Follow students through middle school, high school, and into post-secondary programs
- Focus on STEM

## **AVID Advancement via Individual Determination**


- Elective sections offered to select students in Class of 2024 and 2025
