State of CT and NHS Graduation Requirements:

ONE (1) Credit in Physical Education AND ONE (1) Credit in Health

What this means at NHS: Students will take a total of 2 semesters of PE and 2 semesters of HEALTH at Newtown High.

ALL Class of 2025 students will be enrolled in a semester each (fall or spring) of PE 1 and/or HEALTH 1 during Freshman year.

Students will then have the next 3 years to take a one semester Health 2 course and a one semester PE 2 course (which includes options such as Lifeguarding, Fit for Life and Project Adventure) to meet these requirements included in the students pathway to graduation.
