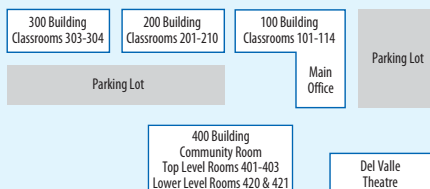
Rooms - Room numbers may change. Check room schedule on the monitors in the hallways.

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PREPARATION for College Level Statistics



Statway is special sequence of courses designed to teach mathematics skills that are essential for a growing number of occupations. It provides students with an alternative to the traditional algebra-based mathematics sequence.

This preparatory course at Acalanes Adult Education is designed to prepare students to transition to Diablo Valley College and successfully complete MATH-144 - Statway II, which is college-level and transferable to the university. Students must successfully complete both sessions (069422 and 069433) in order to meet the pre-requisite required for MATH-144.

STATWAY - Preparation for Math-144 @ DVC*
54 hours lecture/54 hours laboratory per term, Note: TI-83 or TI-84 graphing calculator required
This course introduces the concepts of probability and statistics with requisite arithmetic and algebraic topics integrated throughout. STATWAY satisfies the math requirement for an Associate Degree. It is also intended for students who wish to transfer in humanities or social sciences fields. Topics include data collection, organization and graphical interpretation of data, qualitative and quantitative data sets, measures of central tendency and measures of dispersion, bivariate data and scatter plots, linear functions and their graphs, nonlinear functions and their graphs, and linear and exponential/logarithmic models. Learning strategies for success with an emphasis on study skills, resource acquisition, and maintaining a positive perspective towards learning are also discussed and applied. Non credit class.

Adult Secondary Education

The **Acalanes Adult Education (AAE)** offers the full range of high school classes needed to acquire a high school diploma. The program is approved by the California Department of Education; however the courses do not meet the University of California A to G requirements.

AAE high school diploma and GED preparation classes are offered during the traditional academic year starting September 11, 2019 and ending June 3, 2020. Prospective students must obtain official copies of transcripts for all academic work previously completed so that a realistic and accurate plan can be created to work toward a diploma or to prepare for the GED examination. Classes are scheduled late afternoon or evening to meet the needs of students who work during the day. Students need to commit six hours per week for each class, instructional lab and homework in order to make reasonable progress toward a diploma to graduate.

AUHSD students must register for Intercession and/or Summer School. AAE classes are open to concurrently enrolled high school seniors for graduation credit only when they have previously failed the course.

Credit Towards a Diploma

All high school diploma classes are approved by the CA Department of Education, and courses meet the graduation requirements of the Acalanes Union High School District. To determine what previous academic work counts toward the required units and to make a plan to complete work to receive a diploma, the student must call for an appointment. The student must obtain transcripts of all work done prior to making an appointment. The student may receive credit for previous high school work, military service and work experience.
