Acceptable Use of Computer Resources and the Internet - Regulations

1. All uses of computer resources and the Internet must be in support of education and research and be consistent with the philosophy, beliefs and goals of the Brookfield Board of Education and each of its schools. Each school shall outline specific expectations and/or restrictions pertinent to its educational programs.

- 2. Any use of computer resources and the Internet for commercial or for-profit purposes is prohibited.
- 3. Use of computer resources and the Internet for personal and private business is prohibited.
- 4. No use of computer resources and the Internet shall serve to disrupt the use by others; hardware or software shall not be destroyed, modified, or abused in any way.
- 5. Malicious use of computer resources and the Internet to develop programs that harass other users or infiltrate a computer or computing system and/or damage the software components or a computer or computing system is prohibited. Any attempt to harm, modify or destroy property (e.g., data) belonging to another, including the act of knowingly transmitting computer viruses, shall be considered vandalism.
- 6. Hate mail, harassment, discriminatory remarks and other antisocial behaviors are prohibited. Harassment is the act of deliberately and persistently annoying another user, or intentionally interfering with another's work. Harassment includes the sending of objectionable or offensive mail to others.
- 7. Students are prohibited from installing software for use on district computers.
- 8. Students shall be permitted to use disks containing data created at home, or other locations outside the school site, under the supervision of school staff.
- 9. Use of computer resources and the Internet to access or process obscene material, inappropriate text files, or files dangerous to the integrity of the local area network is prohibited. Each school administration has the authority to monitor, supervise, and/or restrict access.
- 10. Approval for subscriptions to listservs and news groups must be obtained from professional staff.
- 11. Mail from listservs must be monitored daily and deleted from the personal mail directory to avoid excessive use of file server hard-disk space.

- 12. If an individual school in the district deems e-mail and other communication vehicles suitable for educational activities, the following generally accepted rules of network etiquette must be followed:
 - a. Be polite. Don't use vulgar or offensive language. Be aware of cultural differences and avoid slang expressions when exchanging information with other users on the Internet.
 - b. Do not reveal your password, personal address or phone number or personal information about yourself, or other students and colleagues.
 - c. Don't scan personal photographs into correspondence without parent permission and teacher supervision.
- 13. Each school shall develop guidelines consistent with Board policy and administrative regulations. Student users must always have permission before using computer resources and the Internet and follow instructions of their individual school's guidelines. Guidelines and responsible use agreements will be issued and collected by each school at the beginning of each school year and given, at the time of registration, to all those who register after school begins.
- 14. Student users must be supervised when accessing the Internet. Each school principal shall ensure that students will only use the Internet when under staff supervision.
- 15. Any user violating these rules, applicable state and/or federal laws, or posted classroom and district rules is subject to loss of computer resource privileges and/or disciplinary sanctions consistent with Board policies relating to student discipline.
- 16. If rules/guidelines change, all users and parents shall be notified.
