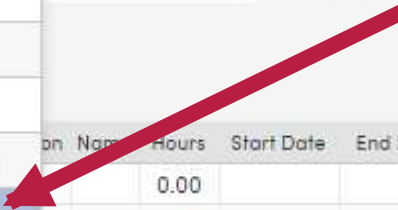

Senior Year Academic Timeline 1st Semester

September

- Check transcripts for accuracy
- Determine if schools you will apply to need official copies of your transcript at time of application.
- Review and note all college admissions requirements and deadlines.
- Register for SAT Reasoning Test, SAT Subject Tests, and/or ACT tests
- Work on rough drafts of applications.
- Give recommendation forms to appropriate individuals.

October

- Prepare for Senior Exit Interview
- Take SAT and ACT tests.
- Submit early decision/early action applications.
- Begin working on UC and CSU applications (CSU applications can be submitted beginning in October)
- Research scholarship opportunities throughout entire senior year.
- Students interested in military careers should sign up for the ASVAB test in the counseling office with Mr. Lockwood
- Get a PIN for yourself and another for a parent (so you can sign your FAFSA online - www.fafsa.ed.gov)

November

- Nov. 1-complete Senior Exit Interview
- Submit college applications for UC and CSU (deadline is Nov. 30th).
- Send transcripts and test scores to colleges.
- Check with each campus' housing services to determine if your housing application is due at the time you submit your general application for admission.
- Take the ASVAB test.
- Create college web portal accounts to receive important information about next steps in the admissions process. CHECK YOUR EMAIL WEEKLY
- Complete your FAFSA application to qualify for FREE money for College

December

- Make sure your official SAT and ACT scores were sent to the colleges you've applied to.
- Submit remaining college applications if appropriate.
- Check college web portal accounts for important to-do lists. (WEEKLY)
- Keep studying and end semester strong with your Finals

Oral Presentation: must include

Specific Goal (include timeliness of that goal)

Reason for pursuing the potential career

Plan of action to achieve the goal/s (education, training, certification, military

Potential career attributes(traits)

Identify the necessary skills needed to be successful in field/career

Identify potential obstacles (financial aid, living situation, etc) and how to overcome them

Encouraged to complete an interview with someone in the field

Community contribution

Reflection of the Senior Culminating Project process

SENIOR EXIT INTERVIEW PART 2

- Demonstration

Conduct a demonstration based on your career/field of interest

- California State Schools application window is from October 1-November 30
- UC Schools application window is from November 1-November 30
- Independent/Private/Out of State Universities vary with their application window and you should go to the schools website to check for “ADMISSION” information
- Community College application window opens in January 2018

SAT AND ACT TEST

SAT

- Scored on scale 400-1600
- Aptitude Test: measures reasoning and verbal abilities
- 3 components: Math, Reading, Writing
- Cannot use calculator
- Go to [Collegeboard.org](https://collegeboard.org) to register

ACT

- Scored on 1-36 Scale
 - Achievement Test: measures what a student has learned
 - 5 components: Math Reading, English, & Science
 - Can use calculator
 - Go to [ACT.org](https://act.org) to register



GRANTS

- Must complete FAFSA to receive Grants
 - DO NOT HAVE TO PAY BACK
 - CAL Grant A=For Low to Middle Income Students
 - 3.0 GPA or higher will cover Tuition and Fees for UC or CSU or private schools
 - Cal Grant B=For Low income students
 - 2.0 GPA or higher will cover Tuition and Fees at UC, CSU or Community College
- Cal Grant C= For Low income students, no GPA requirements

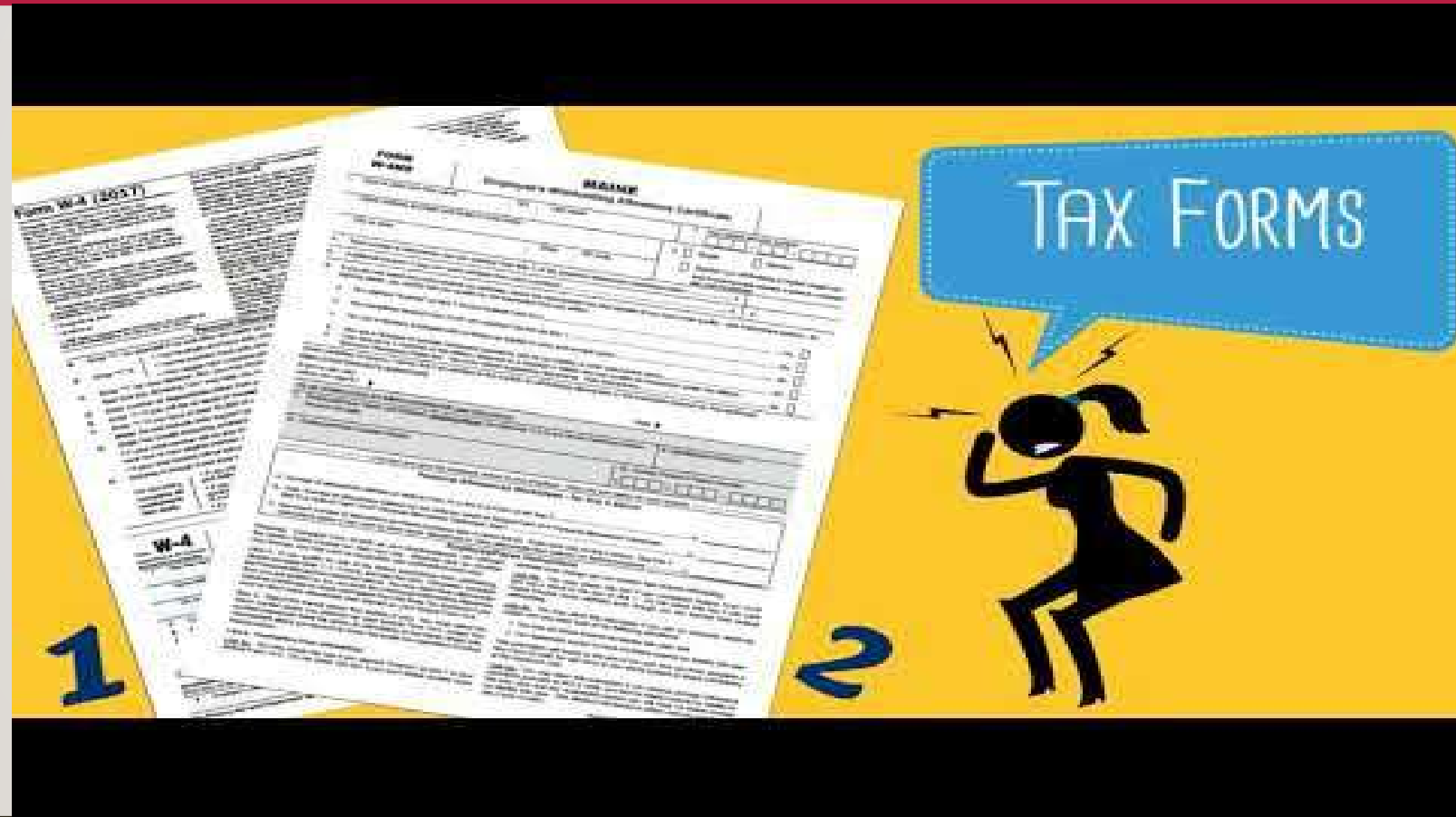

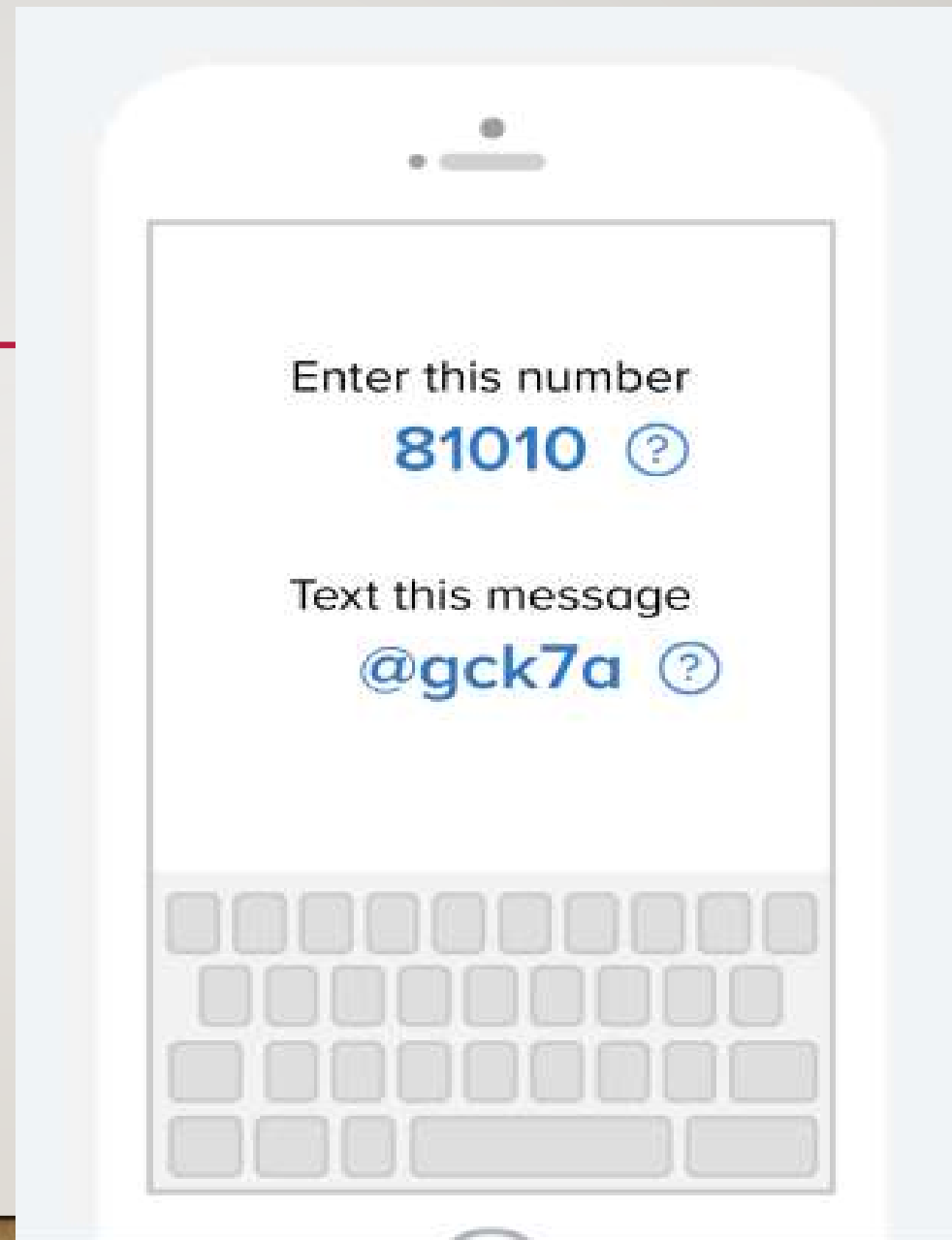


