What is the Honors Program?

The Honors Program is the highest-academic recognition offered at DHS. The benefits include earning college credit, increasing your ACT scores, and recognition with a stole and letterman's jacket.

Honors Program Recognition REQUIREMENTS

- ▶ Pass 18 Honors, Gifted, DE, and/or AP classes with a grade of C or better.
 - 4 Honors, Gifted, Dual Enrollment, & AP English classes
 - 4 Honors, Gifted, Dual Enrollment, & AP Math classes
 - 4 Honors, Dual Enrollment, & AP Science classes
 - 4 Honors, Dual Enrollment, & AP Social Studies classes (must include H Civics, APUSH)
 - 2 additional Honors, Dual Enrollment, & AP classes of your choice
- Earn an overall 85 B average in all Honors, Gifted, DE and AP classes.

Remember:

You MUST start this journey in 9th grade.

Choice 1:

Pursue Honors Program Recognition.

Choice 2:

Take Honors, DE, and AP classes in your area(s) of strength and/or interest.

- ▶ Students can take 1, 2, 3, or 4 Honors courses in 9th-grade.
- Choices include: Honors English I, Honors Geometry, Honors Biology, and Honors Civics.

Note: If a 9th-grader is in Algebra I and wants to *pursue Honor Program Recognition*, he/she must also take Honors Geometry in 9th grade.

Dual Enrollment Program

Student Eligibility Guidelines: 2020-2021

Southeastern Louisiana University, in partnership with local high schools, is pleased to offer qualified students an opportunity to enroll in college courses while still attending high school. Dual enrollment courses are hybrid courses with all content delivered online OR in person via a Southeastern Instructor/Professor. The high school teacher serves as a facilitator by assisting with student registration and enrollment, proctoring exams as necessary, and through supplemental instruction, serving as a daily learning resource for students as they assimilate course content. The Southeastern Instructor/Professor serves as the instructor of record for all dual enrollment courses. Students will earn both high school and college credit for the courses in this program with final grades appearing on the permanent transcripts of both the high school and Southeastern Louisiana University. In order for students to enroll in Dual Enrollment courses, they must meet the eligibility requirements as outlined below and complete a Dual Enrollment Student Application. Please note that high school students can earn a maximum of 27 credits from Southeastern while participating in the Dual Enrollment Program.

Requirements: 2.5 overall GPA, min 11th grade, ACT composite of 19 (ELA – 19, Math – 18)

**Only DE courses that qualify on the TOPS University 5-point scale are acceptable as Honors Program Recognition .

Dual Enrollment** classes offered at DHS

- > 11th grade: DE English III: English Comp I in lieu of AP Language & Composition
- > 12th grade: DE English IV: English Comp II in lieu of AP Literature & Composition
- > 11th or 12th grade: DE College Algebra in lieu of Honors Pre-Calculus
- > 11th or 12th grade: DE College Trigonometry (must take DE College Algebra first)
- > 11th or 12th grade: DE Statistics (must take DE College Algebra first)
- ➤ 11th grade: DE Chemistry I in lieu of Honors Chemistry I
- > 12th grade: DE Chemistry II
- ▶ 12th grade: DE Biology I
- >11th or 12th grade: DE Spanish 101 and DE Spanish 102

Dual Enrollment** classes offered at DHS

*Please note: Dual enrollment credit is only honored at Louisiana public universities and some private/out-of-state universities. Students planning to attend private and/or out-of-state schools should check with that potential university to determine if DE courses are accepted. All students are encouraged to consider AP courses as well.

**Only DE courses that qualify on the TOPS University 5-point scale are acceptable as Advanced Studies Diploma courses.

What's the *difference* between Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment?

Advanced Placement

Dual Enrollment

- AP credit is honored nationally/ globally.
- and some private/out-ofstate universities.
- AP courses are taught by DHS faculty with AP-approved curricula.
- The AP test is given in May and course credit it awarded for scores of 3, 4, or 5, based on the guidelines set by that university.
- Does not impact college transcript

- *DE credit is recognized by LA public universities

- DE courses are taught by faculty in a course designed by Southeastern University.
- DE credit is awarded to 11th & 12th grade students who meet the initial ACT requirement and pass required the in-course tests/assessments.
- College credit on the permanent college transcript

Who can apply for Honors Program classes?

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To enroll in an Honors class at the freshman level, a student should ...

- have earned an A or a B in the preceding class.
- have a core GPA of 3.0.
- have scored **Mastery** or **Advanced** on LEAP tests.
- have strong teacher recommendations.

How do I express interest in Honors Program?

The Honors Program Letter of Intent:

- ➤ Access the DHS Honors Program-Portal Google Classroom. Email dsniezak@stcharles.k12.la.us or ask your counselor if you need the class code.
- > There are 3 simple steps to the process:
 - 1. Complete the Google Form: DHS Student-Survey of Intent for DHS Honors Program.
 - 2. Submit a copy of your most recent report card to dsniezak@stcharles.k12.la.us.
 - 3. Email two of your core teachers and ask them to complete a *teacher recommendation* form on your behalf.
- > Submit all components by May 6, 2022.
