Homework: Assigned daily, due before 8:00am the following day by submission on the Seesaw app. **Late homework will not be accepted.**

Tests: There will be 12 unit tests, corresponding to the 12 units from the course outline. Each test contains approximately 10 multiple choice questions and 2 – 3 free response questions, weighted at 40% and 60% respectively. They are timed tests meant to be completed within one class period. You will be provided with all necessary formulas and tables. **Makeup exams will be given for excused absences, provided that a signed note is presented and the exam is made up within three class days after the original exam date.**

Final Exam: 20 multiple choice questions and 3 free response questions, weighted at 50% each. This will be administered in class on TBA and TBA. **Any student who signs up for and takes the AP Exam is exempt from the final exam.**

Project: This will be assigned after the AP Exam and will be the culminating activity for the course. You will develop your own research question, design a study, and perform a data analysis and inference. You can work independently or with a partner. **This is your last and best chance to demonstrate what you have gained from this course.**
