Letter from the Principal:

Dear East Middle School Families,

I hope you enjoyed the Spring Break weather Grand Junction afforded us over the break. We had some sun and some snow - welcome to Western Colorado! There are several things coming up during the next 9 weeks of school that I would like to highlight; besides testing - the schedule can be found in this newsletter - we have loads of opportunities for students to show what they have learned this year. On April 13, to celebrate the end of testing, we will have a dance at the end of the school day. The theme of the dance will center on the unluckiness of Friday the 13th. Our eighth graders will be walking to CMU for the annual Career Fair. More information will be coming out, but usually we go to the afternoon session. We will need field trip permission forms filled out. We host a track meet on April 17, for several valley middle schools. If you would like to volunteer to help, please contact our office. Colorado West Music Festival starts the 18th and continues through the 21st. Our music students gain so much experience in this and have an opportunity to shine in front of all the schools performing. Our music directors have been working extremely hard to prepare students for this exposure. On April 23, we will be hosting our next class of sixth graders from the feeder elementary schools. Students will be transported to our school from their elementary school so that they can become familiar with our school and community, including their music choices for their 6th grade year. As we endeavor to shape our shared vision with our students, staff, and parents, it became obvious to us that music is VERY important to our students. I am confident there is something for all students to participate in that scratches their musical itch! That evening, we welcome those families back to school for a parent informational meeting from 6-7 in our gym. There will be a presentation and time for questions and answers about the transition to middle school. We would like to invite all parents to attend our PTO meeting on April 24, to see how you can help support your student and their school.

We are excited about the Presentations of Learning coming up in April - the 25th and 26th, to be exact. This time, students will present to the audience (parents and Advisory teacher) their learning and will use a presentation rubric to help them prepare. We encourage you to help your student prepare for these presentations by asking them to reflect on what learning has been the most impactful to them this year. Additionally, having students think about what has been the most challenging as well as what they have learned from those challenges. Your student's Advisor will be contacting you to schedule 20

minutes of time for these presentations. Though you may know what your student is going to present, the opportunity to present to an audience is a great way for students to hit several of the language arts standards. We will also have a presentation by our District, regarding cyberbullying on April 25, from 5 to 6:30 in the East Middle School cafeteria.

Our PTO has been working all year in fundraising efforts to support our annual PRIDE BBQ. This year, we will have the BBQ on Wednesday, May 2 and parents are invited! More information will come, as we will likely want to have a headcount so we can order the correct amount of food. An East Middle School tradition, Enrichment Day, is scheduled for May 7. This is a great opportunity for our students to be exposed to activities that the normal school curriculum and day may not afford. Students will be given opportunities to choose two different activities to enrich their middle school experience. They will be able to choose from activities such as; origami, American Sign Language, mountain biking, CMU campus visits (3 or more), coding, downtown walk to discover the history of GJ, yoga, medical prep, decorative painting, drones, fieldtrip to the Eureka McConnell Science Museum, the Audubon Trail, tennis, basketball, board games - and many others. The cost ranges from free to \$20 for activities such as rock climbing and paddle boarding. We will need permission forms for any of the classes that leave campus and for those businesses that require parental consent. That week is also Teacher Appreciation Week, with the 8th being a specific day of appreciation. Each grade level will coordinate an end of year field trip (again permission slips) and students will need to earn the privilege of attending those field trips by showing their PRIDE by being safe, respectful and responsible. Office referrals may preclude a student's invite to these special activities. Our last day with students is on May 24. It has already been an amazingly full year for us - one that I hope your child has grown measurably and immeasurably from experiencing.
