
WONDERS SKILLS FOR THE WEEK:

- Essential Question: Why do we celebrate holidays? This week students will be learning about why we have holidays and the various ways they are celebrated.
- **Vocabulary:** pride, display, design, purpose, represent, nation, unite
- **Vocabulary Strategy:** Using Context Clues to understand metaphors.
- Sight Words: favorite, few, gone, surprise, wonder, young
- Phonics Rule: r-controlled vowels: air /are / ear /. All of these spellings can be pronounced the same as "chair", "care" and "wear". Though they're pronounced the same, they are spelled differently. Students should be able to recognize this group of letters as one single Chunked sound.
- **Grammar:** Adverbs that tell how. An adverb is a word that tells more about the action in a sentence. An adverb can tell how an action happened. Many adverbs end in –ly, such as "nicely" or "carefully".
- **Spelling Words:** fair, pair, bear, wear, spare, share, three, splash, favorite, surprise
- Writing: Write an opinion text.
- Don't forget to click "submit" after completing each assignment.
