- REVIEW TESTS/ FINAL EXAM: All review tests and the final exam may only be taken once.
- NOTES: A minimum of a half page of notes per lesson is required for this class. Answers to test questions practice or otherwise will not be considered notes and if present will affect the grade negatively.
