Pierce County's One Percent for Art ordinance directs publicly-funded construction projects, with costs exceeding \$100,000, to allocate one percent of the project budget for public art.

This program supports our mission to provide cultural enrichment for all Pierce County residents.

PUBLIC ARTWORK

Rotating Art Collection

Works in painting, photography, mixed media, prints and fiber arts comprise the collection of more than 100 works of art. This collection is rotated periodically throughout the public spaces of Pierce County facilities.

Works are permanently installed at various Pierce County locations.

HIGH SCHOOL ART COLLECTION
