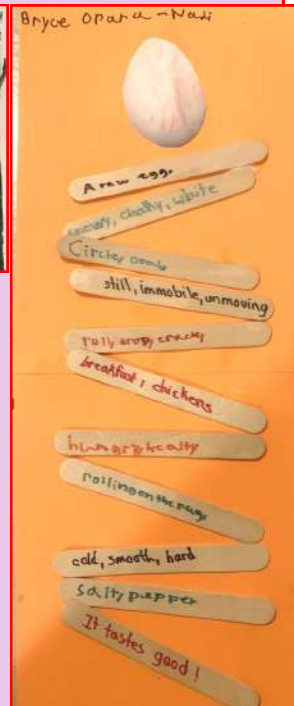
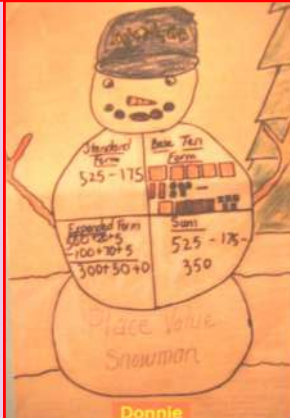
Special Honors

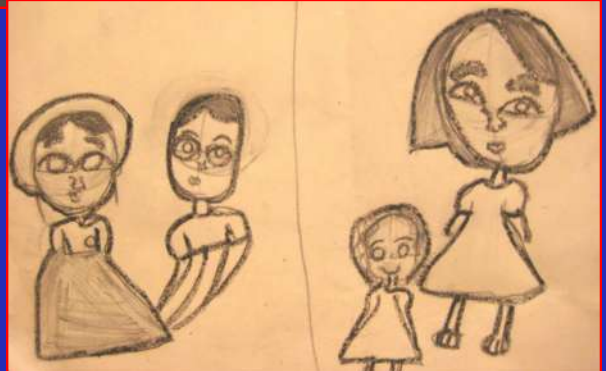
Art in the Classroom



In February, Ms. Walker works with a fourth grade class designing individualized Valentine cards.



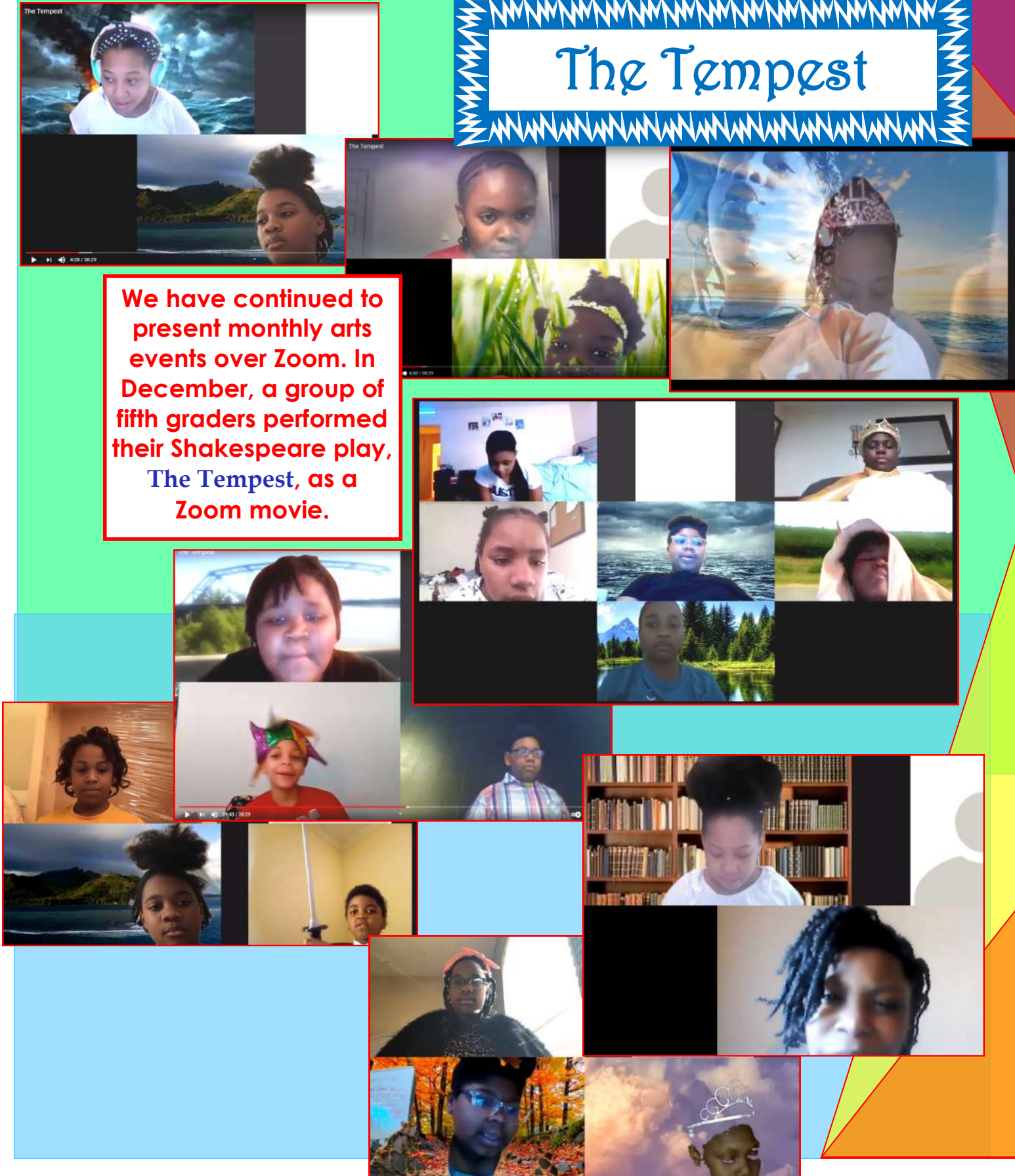
After reading the story "Grandfather's Journey" about a Japanese who travels to America and back, the third graders made Japanese-styled "manga" comic strips to retell the story through their images.

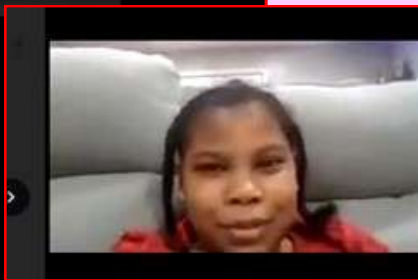
The Tempest
