Introduction

General ART Contest & Scoring:

- Part A of the contest requires the contestant to identify the names of 15 selected artists and titles of pictures selected randomly by the director from the official list of 30 pictures.
- Part B consists of 30 questions about art history and art elements characteristic of the 30 art selections.



- A perfect score is 120.
- In <u>Part A</u>, award two points if the artist's name is correct; award one point if the artist's name is correct but misspelled. Award two points if the title of the art is correct; award one point if the title of the art is correct but misspelled. (Student's can earn up to 4pts per painting)
- In <u>Part B</u>, award two points for each correct answer. Do not deduct points; simply award no points for incorrect or unanswered items.














Color Wheel
