




Communication

Literacy skills and reading strategies for both fiction and non-fiction are taught using whole group novels, small group literature discussion groups and the Holt McDougal text.

- A combination of large group and small group instruction occurs throughout the year.
- Students will have at least 10 minutes of free reading time daily.
- Library visits are scheduled every two weeks for book talks and book check-out.

SOAR Social Studies

• Mrs. Hurkett

- This class is considered a secondary level intervention for students to strengthen their fluency and comprehension in order to become independent readers of expository text (non-fiction).
- This class will cover the same sixth-grade social studies material; however, more time is spent on growing in background knowledge, vocabulary, fluency, and comprehension. Students can move in and out of SOAR throughout the school year.





• Sixth Grade Science Units:

Diversity of Life, **Models and Design** and **Chemical Interactions.**

 Science class basic information: Daily science starters, cooperative groups, most work finished in class, homework when assigned lasts typically 10-15 minutes, and study guides are provided with each test at least one week in advance.


