Abstract (adj.)

- Pulled away from a direct relation to anything
- Impersonal in attitudes or views

Attract (v.)

- To pull into something
- To pull into oneself

Contract (v.)

- To pull together to make a smaller size
- To pull inward; the opposite of "expand"



Water contracts when it freezes, but it expands when it thaws.

Distract (v.)

 To pull a person's attention in another direction



Try not to **distract** the vet while he is giving your pet a shot.

Extract(v.)

To pull out by force



The dentist **extracted** a tooth from the patient.

Protract(v.)

- To pull out
- To make something take longer
- To prolong




Do not make it take so long to get ready. You are **protracting** so we will be late.

Retraction(n.)

 A statement or promise that is pulled back or taken away,



The magazine agreed to print a <u>retraction</u> because the article was not accurate.

Subtract(v.)

 To pull something out, therefore having less left over

You were paid \$20.00 dollars. You owe your sister \$12.00 dollars. If you subtract \$12.00 from \$20.00, you will \$8.00 dollars for yourself.

Traction (n.)

 A pull to the arm or leg muscles to bring a bone back into place when it is dislocated or fractured



The boy was in traction because he had broken his leg.

Tractor(n.)

 A vehicle that pulls farm machines and hauls heavy loads



The **tractor** is used to haul heavy loads such as cement.
