ART 1 Syllabus Fall 2020

Art 1 is a basic course that provides a foundation for additional art courses that follow. This course is primarily devoted to providing systemic presentation of various art processes, theories, and historical developments. This course is a studio type class. The focus of the course is experimenting with different art media and to prepare you to take future art classes.

At the beginning of the year this is going to be new and different. There will be a lot of learning on how to navigate through Schoology, attend virtual teachings, staying organized, etc. If there are ever questions that arise, please don't hesitate to contact me. <u>We need to work together and communicate to make this successful!</u>

We learn/draw a lot in Art 1:

Introduced to the Visual Elements of Art and Principles of Design Draw from direct observation daily Proficiency in basic one and two point perspective Become accomplished using graphite and charcoal Achieve value/3d effect on a 2d surface Color Theory using chalk pastel and oil pastel Exposure to 3d sculpture and design Art history and introduction to analyzing and describing artwork

GRADING POLICY:

Formal Assessment: 70%

Projects (These are the final art pieces students create) A <u>Rubric</u> is followed when grading and will be provided with each Project

Daily Progress: 30%

These grades will consist of a number of activities/assignments. It could vary from:

*Direct observational drawings

*The preparation of drawings that will conclude to a larger project *Participating in a discussion board about the live artist videos students will watch, etc.

Art pieces that are turned in always need to be of your best quality! We still have high expectations.

Art Materials:

You can see the two items we are asking you to buy on my homepage. If you cannot, please let me know and we can assist you.

Under the **Art Materials Tab** you will also find a list of <u>suggested</u> materials you can buy. There are only <u>two</u> materials necessary for Art 1: the sketchbook, and charcoal pencils. We do plan to <u>provide</u> these as projects move along. We will have days that you can come to the school to pick up these Art Kits. These materials in the kits <u>will</u> <u>have to be returned</u> as other students will need to use. Materials will be sanitized when returned before given out to the next group of students.

Like always, if you want your own set of materials, then you can look at the list and buy at your discretion. For Art 1 if you want to buy, I would suggest extra willow charcoal and the charcoal pencils.

Teaching day to day:

Daily Assignments and Projects will be organized in Folders in Schoology. There will be a variety of material in each folder. It may consist of documents to read, <u>videos I have made that are teaching the lesson for you to watch (we will call</u> <u>these Teaching Videos)</u>, videos that correlate to the lesson of certain artists, etc.

My Teaching Videos are going to be the main source of learning the assignment/project. These are highly important. You will have to make sure you <u>open and WATCH/READ each material</u>. You may have to rewatch my teaching video several times. Make sure you are able to <u>listen</u> to what I am saying in the video. Directions to assignments/projects will be typed out too.

There will be times you will be asked to watch a video of an artist and participate in a class discussion board.

Synchronous/Live Teaching Days:

At least twice a week I will have live teachings through WebEx or the Conference App in Schoology. The projected times for the live teachings are posted on the <u>Fall</u> <u>2020 Schedule Tab.</u> These are subject to change/shift.

At these times I may teach something new, reteach/clarify a current project we are on, and this will be a great time you can show me your work and receive feedback from me.

I would <u>strongly suggest</u> making a New Folder in your Google Drive and label it Artwork or Art I or whatever you desire. <u>When you complete assignments/projects</u> <u>you will have to take a picture and then submit to Schoology.</u> It would be great to be organized and have all your photos/work for this class in one place/folder.
