REGULAR MEETING, August 11, 2016

*Board approved the agenda. Roll call was taken. Minutes from the June 2 meeting were approved.

*Congratulations/Information – Wiggins High School awarded bronze ranking in News Week for schools preparing students for college and career at a high level. Wiggins High School one of 6 districts in the state awarded CDE & REL Closing the Achievement Gap Award. This award was for students showing growth on the ACT over a 5 year span in the middle class, minority and free and reduced lunch categories. Mr. Kerr presented at CASE Conference on how Wiggins School District has beat the odds over the past 5 years.

*Public Participation – None.

*Board Reports – None.

*Mr. Bruntz, Superintendent, reported everything is on schedule for the beginning of the new school year. The maintenance, transportation and technology departments have been working hard this summer preparing for the new school year. Principals and admin assistants have been preparing for registration. Teachers report August 12th. There will be an Open House/Back to School Night for both the elementary and secondary schools on Wed., August 17. Secondary will start at 5:30 pm in the Event Center and Elementary at 6:30 in the Elementary School. Classes for 1st-12th students will begin on August 18. Kindergarten start date is August 25.

*Lisa Trautwein, Preschool Director, reported the preschool received a rating of 4 out of 5 stars through the Colorado Shines system. Staff will be reviewing the results of the rating and making changes as warranted. The summer program was June 6-August 5 with 15 children enrolled. The District has been allocated 27 CPP for the upcoming school year. First day of preschool is September 6.

*Trent Kerr gave a building report: The RFQ for an Owner's Rep has been released. An Owner's Rep can assist the District with informational language and materials for the bond process. The top 3 applicants will be interviewed on August 24th. Assessed valuations for the counties did not decrease as much as projected allowing the District to construct more learning spaces for less impact on taxes. With the current projections, a bond of \$31 mil would cost a taxpayer \$50.86 annually on \$100,000 on residential property, \$185.28 for business, \$123.78 for 1/4 sec sprinkler, \$111.12 1/4 sec flood, \$20.81 1/4 sec dry farmland and \$7.90 for 1/4 sec grazing. The bond wouldn't be a new tax but rather an extension of the current bond.
