Emotions in Middle School- What to Expect

Middle School Students can be moody, private, self-conscious, have changes in physical growth, and stronger attachment to peers.

- o <u>Managing the Moods</u>- The expectations of middle school, worries about friends, sports, schoolwork, changing bodies and family expectations can all cause moodiness in your son or daughter. Let them know you are available to talk and invite them to open up by asking questions like, "Hey______, I know Middle School can be a challenge, describe how your week was..." or "It seems like something is bothering you, and I am here to listen whenever you are ready. Let me know when and I will make time for you."
- o <u>Finding Privacy</u>- This is a natural desire for the "tweener" phase of life. Giving a middle school child reasonable space is healthy. Set the limits of that privacy so they know what to expect.
- o <u>Fitting in</u>- Feeling self-conscious is also common in middle school. Help foster opportunities for your child to focus on his/her strengths and common interests in healthy ways. Encouraging participation in teams, clubs, and activities is a great confidence builder.
- *The counseling office will be providing workshops and support groups for students, parents, and staff in addition to scheduling, individual intervention, and social emotional support throughout the year. We look forward to partnering with you and your student! *

Groups can benefit all kinds of people and are designed to support and complement skills students already possess as well as improve coping skills in any life situation.

Groups are structured and goal focused. Students learn important life skills that enhance their ability to succeed academically and socially as well as cope with stressful situations. Groups usually meet once a week over several weeks for approximately 45 minutes.

The following is a list of possible groups that RMS Counseling team will offer:

- Managing Difficult Emotions skills to help cope with challenging emotions and situations
- Personal Growth empowering students to build self-esteem
- Student success skills academic and social skills needed for school success
- Communication and conflict management
- Self-control and anger management
- Changing Families dealing with divorce and other family changes
- Grief-support dealing with emotions, changes, and loss of loved one
- Friendship- developing skills to build, maintain and make new friends

This year we will be trying something different with our college and career component of the counseling curriculum. We would like to use lunch time to expose all grade levels to different careers. Students will have an opportunity to sign up for these workshops in advance. 

2018 HAWAIIAN DISCOVERY FIELD TRIP

Aloha!

Announcing the 2018 Hawaiian Discovery Field Trip. You are invited to attend an FYI meeting on Tuesday, August 29 at 6:00 PM in the cafeteria. It is the same agenda for the meeting last spring.

The Trip is a 9 – day learning adventure which allows students the opportunity to *experience* Hawaii from a scientific perspective. The Big Island provides an ideal setting for students to *discover* firsthand the dynamic interaction of sun, sea, and volcano which created a diverse collection of tropical ecosystems.

It is an academic trip. Lessons are conducted on an on-going basis as we encounter various aspects of terrestrial ecosystem biology, geology, marine biology, and other related science topics. In addition, the cultural history of Hawaii is a natural extension of the coursework.

We camp the entire trip at county and National Park campgrounds. Students are responsible for all of the camping skills – pitching tents, cooking meals on a backpack –style stove, etc.

The trip is open to next year's 8th graders and students from other schools may apply. It costs \$2475 (additional costs may include purchasing items like snorkeling gear and some camping gear). \$300 non-refundable deposits and applications are required. Space is limited.
