- C. Budget (10 points)
- D. Resume (15 points)
- E. Letters of recommendation (15 points)
- F. Transcript (10 points)

AWARD INFORMATION: The recipients of the scholarship will be notified by mail. Checks will be mailed to the students' educational institution at the beginning and the end of the first semester providing the students maintain a 2.0 GPA or better and qualify as a full time student first semester. The recipients are required to send a copy of their grades, student ID number, and evidence of continued enrollment as a full time student at the end of their first semester.
