The District's Wellness Committee is seeking volunteers to serve on the committee. The Bethel Board of Education recognizes that childhood obesity has reached epidemic levels in Connecticut and throughout the country. Overweight children are at a higher risk for developing severe long-term health problems, and overweight children are affected by discrimination, psychological stress, and low self-esteem. However, research indicates that obesity and subsequent diseases are largely preventable through diet and regular physical activity. Research also indicates that becoming physically active and maintaining a regular physical activity program significantly reduces the risk of obesity, and some cancers, diabetes, and other chronic diseases.

Children who eat well-balanced meals and are healthy are more likely to be successful learners in the classroom. The Bethel Board of Education supports increased emphasis on



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nutrition as well as physical activity, at all grade levels to enhance the well-being of our District's youth.

In order to respond appropriately and efficiently to these serious nutrition and health issues, the Bethel Public Schools established an ongoing District Wellness Committee to establish goals for and oversee school health and nutrition policies and programs, including development, implementation, and periodic review. Are you concerned that your child may be experiencing difficulties or delays with talking, play skills, problem solving skills or making their needs known?

If so, you and your child (3-5 years old) are encouraged to participate in a Circle of Friends screening. While meeting the staff to discuss your concerns or ask questions regarding your child's development, your child will take part in informal play activities that include songs and motor activities.

The preschool team includes the Supervisor of Special Education, Preschool Special Education Teachers, Speech/Language Pathologist, Occupational Therapist, Physical Therapist and School Social Worker.

Screening dates for the 2017-2018 school year are: Wednesdays from 10:00-10:45 AM, May 30, 2018

If school is closed because of inclement weather, the pre-school screen will be cancelled.

AP Testing at Bethel High School

The scholars of Bethel High School will sit for their Advanced Placement tests starting on Monday, May 7th and ending on Friday, May 18th. Students should get plenty of rest, eat a well-balanced breakfast, stay hydrated, and arrive on time for the exam. For test security, all cell phones will be collected prior to testing and returned once all tests are collected. We wish our young scholars the best of luck during this period time. Next Generation Science Standards Field Test for all BHS Juniors on May 21-22

The Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) has required that all juniors across the state take the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) test this spring. The NGSS Assessment Field Test is necessary to evaluate new items aligned to the NGSS for use on future test forms. This new test is replacing the legacy CAPT science assessment. Please note that since the science test is a field test, there will be no district, school, or student results reported.

The NGSS Field Test is an untimed assessment that will be administered on computer. The assessment will require students to use information, observations, and data to think and act like scientists. Questions will challenge students to show a deeper understanding of their scientific knowledge by making sense of the natural world and solving problems. Sample NGSS assessment items are available at https://airscience.tds.airast.org/student. Students can try these before the field test.

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The field test will be administered to Grade 11 students at Bethel High School on May 21-22 with makeups on May 23-25. Most students will take the assessment on their Chromebooks in their science class. Additional supports are available for students with special needs, as determined by an individualized education program (IEP) or 504 Plan. Students will receive two hours of community service for participating in this field test.


