COMMITTEE REPORTS

A.C.E.S. Representative

Mrs. Hlavac read into the minutes a report as listed below.

"The ACES Governing Board met on March 10, 2016. The minutes of the previous meeting were accepted. The Commissioner of Education, Dr. Dianna Wentzell, was a guest speaker. She indicated that the Governor's budget proposal held whole the ECS and the Alliance District Grants for next year but expected

cuts of around \$70 million will need to be absorbed. Discussion took place regarding a number of topics including the desire to have test scores back to districts more quickly; utilizing students' standardized test scores as part of teacher evaluations, the validity and reliability of the standardized tests being administered and information about school districts' evaluation plans. The Governing Board approved the filing of the fiscal reports (subject to audit) and authorized the following: acceptance of resignations, confirmation of retirements, leaves of absence, and the hiring of staff/transfers/position changes as detailed on the Human Resources Report. The monthly Early Head Start report was approved. The Governing Board approved the tuition and rates for 2016-2017. The Governing Board approved the following program budgets for the 2016-2017 school year: Mill Road School, Whitney High East/West, Whitney High North, Village School, Village School EIBI and the Center for Autism and Developmental Disorders, The Educational Center for the Arts, Technology Services and Transportation. The budgets for the Thomas Edison Middle School and the Wintergreen Inter-District Magnet School were approved by the respective Steering Committees for those schools. The Governing Board approved the Little Theater Building project, State project no. 244-0037 as complete. Under Old Business, guest speaker Dr. Alice Torres, Director of Early Childhood Services provided an update on the Early Head Start Program. The Governing Board approved the Early Head Start monthly report. Erika Forte, Asst. Executive Director indicated in the Curriculum Report that students participated appropriately during administration of the SAT, mid-year teacher evaluations were done and that the next PD will take place on March 24, 2016. There are 100 Wallingford students attending ACES programs."

Wintergreen Magnet School Steering Committee

Mr. Votto reported that there was a meeting on February 24th. He said the Assistant principal reported and the 2016-2017 budget was approved. There was discussion about having 190 school days with 195 days for teachers. There was a three percent increase to schools who participate.

School to Career Representative/Business ThinkTank

Dr. Menzo reported at the meeting this month there was an update on the Credit for Life program.

PTAC Update

Dr. Menzo stated that the meeting included an update on the bus cameras, a photography update, a budget update, formation of a Dress Code Committee, and the Prom Pledge. He explained that if students sign the Prom Pledge they will be able to be entered into a drawing to receive a limo ride to the prom, gift certificates to have nails and hair done and other items also.

Lyman Hall Athletic Complex Improvement Committee

Mr. Deptula reported that there have been no meetings but they will resume in May.

Plan of Conservation Development

There was no report.

Food Services Strategic Plan Committee

Dr. Menzo reported that the food service workers have met as a committee. He stated there have been some changes made to the food that is being served such as making pizzas right at the school and it isi cut into 6 pieces instead of 8. He said the finances are looking better.
